Waiting, praying, getting closer to Venerable Henriette Delille

At this time we are waiting - waiting for news from Rome. Waiting for Mere Henriette to be named **Blessed**. What do we do while we wait? We pray and try to get closer to Mere Henriette. And at the same time, we get closer and closer (hopefully) to Jesus.

While we wait, we also think about the journey that got us to March 27, 2010, the day Pope Benedict XVI declared Mere Henriette venerable.

We began this journey in 1988. Once the petition was accepted, our job was to make Mere Henriette known and to promote devotion to her. Every means possible was used to get this done. Of course, the historical commission did their work. Books were published. Many people began praying through Henriette's intercession for many favors and miracles. Many answered.

By 2005 two tribunals were held: first for the life, virtues, and reputation of sanctity in New Orleans and second the tribunal for the alleged miracle in the

Galveston-Houston Archdiocese.

In 2007, the *Positio*, a compilation and a defense of all the research, was completed by our postulator, Dr. Andrea Ambrosi, which had to be approved by the following.

- ❖ October 7, 2008, seven historians approved the *positio*.
 - ❖ May 29, 2009, nine theologians gave their approval.
 - ❖ March 2, 2010, 15 Archbishops and Cardinals from the Congregation for the Causes of Saints affirmed that Henriette Delille practiced heroic virtue.
 - ❖ March 27, 2010, the Holy Father declared Henriette venerable.
- The research into Henriette's life is now finished with a positive decision
- ❖ 2010, the *Positio* on the alleged miracle was completed.

This *positio* must be studied and approved by

Venerable Henriette Delille's life, reputation of sanctity, and practice of heroic virtue expands

Venerable Henriette Delille is becoming better known and loved. There are many reasons for this. One reason is that Archbishop Gregory Aymond has included her in the "Family Prayer for the 'New Battle of New Orleans' against violence, murder, and racism."

This prayer is said in all the churches of the Archdiocese at all of the Masses during the Lenten season. The prayer follows:

We implore you to give us your wisdom that we may build a community founded on the values of Jesus, which gives respect to the life and dignity of all people.

Bless parents that they may form their children in faith. Bless and protect our youth that they may be peacemakers of our time. Give consolation to those who have lost loved ones through violence.

Hear our prayer and give us the perseverance to be a voice for life and human dignity in our community.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Our Lady of Prompt Succor, hasten to

help us.

Mother Henriette Delille, pray for us that we may be a holy family.

My son was diagnosed with pneumonia and sent home with antibiotics from the emergency room. A day later he was coughing up blood and was brought back to the hospital.

Doctors felt that he might have a blood clot in his lungs and needed to be placed immediately on blood thinners.

I began saying her prayer and within approximately five minutes the doctor came back and said the radiologist had just called to say that he checked his test again and realized it wasn't a clot after all but just a bad case of pneumonia.

My son and I were so relieved! I left her prayer at

his bedside and told him to pray to her daily.

I'm happy to report that he was released four days later and is now back at work. I do believe in miracles and I know that she has bestowed one on me.
