





A SPECIAL MOMENT IN HISTORY FOR THE OBLATE SISTERS OF PROVIDENCE

Georgetown University Building Renamed for Pioneer Black Educator Anne Marie Becraft

In 1831, she left her school in the hands of a promising student and moved to Baltimore to join the Oblate Sisters of Providence, the first African American female religious order in the country. She took the name Sister Mary Aloysius.

She was a devout Catholic and deeply committed to educating young girls of color in the nation's capital. Though she experienced both anti-Catholic and anti-black intimidation, she

nevertheless responded to her calling to teach and to serve God.

Georgetown dedicated another building during the same ceremony in remembrance of Isaac Hawkins. Isaac Hawkins was one of the 272 enslaved people sold by the Maryland Province of Jesuits to Louisiana plantation owners in 1828. A liturgy and other events were also held that day as a beginning of a journey towards healing from the Jesuits of Georgetown's historical ties to slavery and its steps toward contrition and

Connected intimately to the historical impact of the Oblate Sisters of Providence, Ann Loretta Dove with Sister M. Virginia Fish, O.S.P. (previous director of the Mother Lange Guild) started the St. Peter Claver Chapter – Mother Mary Lange (SPC-MML) Guild in St. Inigoes, MD in the year 2000. There was no better place for the establishment of this Guild, thought Loretta. After all, St. Mary's County is the "Home of Catholicism." The Oblates taught at St. Peter Claver School and Cardinal Gibbons Institute, and Ann, better known by her middle name, Loretta, was taught by the Oblates themselves. So, Loretta had experienced for herself the profound spiritual, educational, social and economic impact of Mother Lange through the Oblates.

Since the time of its formation, the SPC-MML Guild has been steadfast in its commitment to the cause of the beatification and canonization of Mother Lange. Annually, members pray for the Cause, financially donate to the Cause, hold events for the Cause, and attend events held for the Cause. Specifically, members of the SPC-MML Guild perform the following

- Attend the Celebration of Mother Lange Death and the Re-commitment Programs.
- Hold fundraisers to financially support the MML Guild with our monetary donations.
- Distribute and promote at events the Mother Mary Lange Prayer Cards and the trifold which tells the story of her life at events that they hold as well as other events held at the church.
- Pray the Rosary in our Mother Lange Chapel every Wednesday for the sainthood intention.
- Educate attendees at our annual Labor Day Festival about Mother Lange by distributing literature and prayer cards, having a quiz about her life, and selling Mother Lange Tee Shirts.
- Pray the rosary every Friday as part of the Guild's new CALL TO PRAY THE ROSARY (CPR) Program which was initiated on January 13, 2017. This toll free teleconference program allows anyone in the community to join Guild members in praying the rosary at 2:00 p.m. on Fridays on the telephone

(telephone number1-712-770-4141, ACCESS CODE 894355).

The St. Peter Claver Chapter – Mother Mary Lange Guild in St. Inigoes, MD is forever committed to pressing forward to achieve the goal of the canonization of Mother Lange.
