



As autumn slips into winter, It is a time to pursue personal health and wellness.




Some folks tone and strengthen muscles, Other folks mindfully meditate on positions and words.

The Grounds Committee wishes all a safe winter and all the best for the coming New Year.






The Ways and Means Department is Busy!


Classics Book Group

In the wake of the devastating hurricanes in August and September, Girls' Club rep Lily Kinley and her mom, advisor Tami Kinley, coordinated the Club's town-wide drive for clothing and cereal for storm victims. We shipped 175 cereal boxes to the Houston Food Bank and over 200 pounds of clothing to Trusted World for those who were displaced by Hurricane Harvey.

On September 24th, we held our first General Membership meeting. We collected yet more cereal and were able to send another 75 boxes to Puerto Rico for victims of Hurricane Maria. In addition, the girls donated dog treats and made over 150 doggie goodie bags to be sent to dogs who have been affected by the hurricanes and who are being taken in and cared for in our local animal shelters. The goodie bags were delivered to the Mt. Pleasant Animal Shelter, which was expecting a planeload of puppies on that day!

Throughout September and October, Girls' Club members could be seen helping all over town -- we volunteered at Linden Avenue School's and Forest Avenue School's back to school events, as well as many Halloween festivities, such as the Harvest Festival and the Pumpkin Walk at Linden and the Forest Festival of Jack O'Lanterns. We also helped with the Middletown Halloween Party and, for the first time, helped with childcare at the Home and School meetings at Linden.

Because the weather has been so nice, we have had the opportunities to do a lot of service events outside. Many girls helped with the Freeman Gardens pumpkin sale and worked the snack stand at the GRAA football games. We are helping a lot with fall gardening around the Club house. We have been working with Sue Cali on maintenance and cleanup of the grounds. We've also worked on the grounds of the Montclair Art Museum. In addition to this, we raised almost \$1,000 washing cars and will be donating the money to support local charities, and a portion went to ManiCURE Night to support our fight against breast cancer.

Our biggest event of the past two months was, of course, ManiCURE Night. ManiCURE Night is one of our favorite traditions, where we paint the nails of the younger girls in our community, do their makeup, give them hair extensions, have raffle baskets, and have various carnival games to play. We are very pleased to announce that we will be donating \$6,500 to the Connie Dwyer Breast Center in Newark! A big 'Thank you' to the Women's Club for supporting this event in so many ways! Special thanks to chair Carolyn Twitchell and advisors Annie Bayne and Lyn Vaux for creating lots of new games and activities. ManiCURE Night was a huge success!

Starting in early October, we fundraised in lots of different ways, like at football games and with popsicle sales at Ridgewood Avenue School. We also raised \$2,800 with our annual coin drive with the Boiling Springs Bank. We thank the Women's Club for helping with our "Flock Together for the Fight" program, which is where you can purchase a flamingo in honor of someone affected by breast cancer. The flamingoes are then placed on the front lawn of the Women's Club to show solidarity in the fight against breast cancer.

Coming up soon we have the semi-annual Breakfast Run, where we travel to New York City early one Saturday morning with hot breakfast, bagged lunches, and donations of clothing and toiletries for the homeless. The girls are looking forward to the annual Candy Cane dance, which is December 9th. We are also excited to contribute to the Wynona's House toy drive in the upcoming months of November and December.




