## Art Department Monthly Meeting and Luncheon "Seeing America" Tuesday, March 6<sup>th</sup>

Please join us for lunch on March 6<sup>th</sup> to welcome the Newark Museum Speakers Bureau and their amazing presentation of "Seeing America," one of the finest and most comprehensive American art collections in the the United States. "Seeing America" examines the powerful impact that artists have had on shaping American culture and identity.

The slide presentation is a detailed overview of the collection, which covers the work of artists who interpreted the people, culture, and tenor of their times: from United States Native American art to original colonial portraits and folk art, through the Hudson River landscape period of the 19<sup>th</sup> century to today's contemporary works.

There will be more than 60 distinct pieces of art examined in the presentation. Legendary artists and works to be surveyed include: *Twilight "Short Arbiter 'Twixt Day and Night"* by Frederick Edwin Church, from the landscape gallery; *Mrs. Charles Thursby*



by John Singer Sargent, a quintessential example of the new woman genre; *The Voice of the City of New York Interpreted* by Joseph Stella; Georgia O'Keeffe's *Purple Petunias*, and Andy Warhol's *Campbell's Soup Can*.

Guest speaker Mac McParland will describe the history and production of mezcal, including photos from his visits to Oaxaca ("wa-HA-ka") Mexico, the birthplace of mezcal and mole sauces. You'll get to taste several brands of mezcal, displaying a range of smokiness from mild to intense - not unlike scotch! Mac will describe how to incorporate mezcal into your cocktails and cooking at home - and provide some samples, as well.

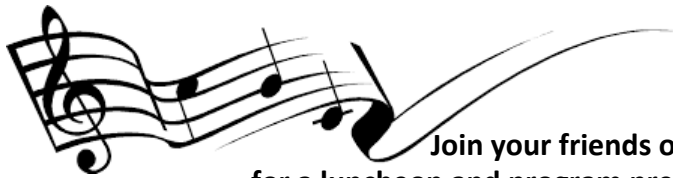

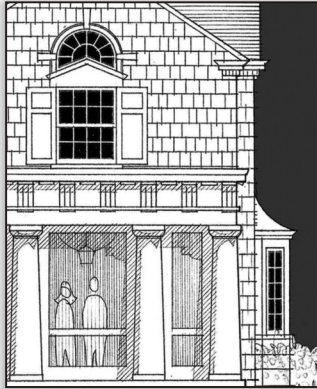
