### See Me Do It — (Almost Perfect)



See Me Do It

Two one-hundredths (.02) of a second is all that prevents See Me Do It from being perfect in her racing career. A little bad luck and the .02 of a second is all that separates the sorrel On A High - Rita Seis filly from being a million dollars plus earner. Winner of nine out of ten starts, See Me Do It's only blemish is a second in the Quarter Horse industry's richest race, the All American Futurity.

See Me Do It established a new stakes record of 21.25 in the 1989 All American Derby, eclipsing the old record of 21.33 set by Ronas Ryon. Included in the field, which was beaten by one and a half lengths, was Mitey Easy Dash, Brace It, Sig Hanson, Super De Kas, Power Effort, Jeweled Cash, Zevisator, and Wicked Wind.

Jockey Larry Layton and trainer Bobby Turner also bested a quality field at Ruidoso Downs on July 3 in the Rainbow Derby. Beaten by the Jean Dillard filly were Floyd De Great, winner of the Grade I Kansas Derby, Sig Hanson, Casady King, Barbs Bounce, Power Effort, Mito Native, Wicked Wind, Six Kiss and Aloulou.

Twenty years after breeding the Champion 2- and 3-year-old Gelding Howdy Jones, Jean Dillard repeated with having See Me Do It named Champion 2-year-old Filly in 1988. Dillard, a Ringling, Oklahoma ranch owner, accomplished the breeding feat with a home bred broodmare line that goes back to champion producer Miss Breeze Bar, a AAA daughter of Breeze Bar AAAT. See Me Do It is a daughter of Rita Seis, who is by Easy Six, and out

of Missy Te, a multiple stakes producer out of Miss Breeze Bar.

See Me Do It is from the first crop of On A High, winner of \$1,167,234 and the Grade I All American Futurity.

During her 2-year-old year, See Me Do It established her promise of greatness, first by winning the Oklahoma Futurity at Blue Ribbon Downs and then by winning her trial to the Shebester Futurity in a clocking of 19.96 while no one else qualified in a time less than 20.32. Because of heavy rains the speedy filly skipped the finals at the Shebester Futurity.

Had racing luck for Jean Dillard and See Me Do It been .02 seconds faster, one could call it "perfect" instead of almost perfect.
