Believing in Christ, we are called to grow and are sent to serve.

Thinking Out Loud With Pastor Josh.

"In the tender compassion of our God, the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace." – Luke 1.78-79, Zechariah's prophecy

We have avoided it and kept it private. We have hoped it would go away. That it would slink back into its hole in the ground and remain out of the light. We've put off the conversation or quietly given thanks when it hasn't come up around the dinner table or the communion table.

Friends, we don't want to talk about racism. We don't want to hear the word because when it's brought up, there is a stench of contagion that seems to waft from it. We don't want that stink on us. We don't want to imagine it infecting our lives.

Unfortunately though, it does. It has. Sin always finds its way. Hate speech moves about our thoughts as it drifts over the pages of our newspapers and across our screens. It seeps into the ideas of our children and takes root in their minds, where it slowly, secretly grows.

The sin of racism is part of our national history. The sin of racism is part of our national conversation. The sin of racism is being given a voice by people across our nation, and sometimes in our families, and it is no longer afraid of the light. As often as it is spoken out loud and deemed acceptable, racism against non-white peoples is available for our youngest ones to claim. It's validated and affirmed and worn publicly on shirts and flags.

Racism against African Americans and people of color is being normalized. Again.

None of us wants to talk about it. Yet, we don't have a choice. Because none of us is immune to its effects. And, we are people of God and followers of a savior who grants us the power to denounce these forces and all of their empty promises. We are a voice of Grace and forgiveness as we have been forgiven. We have been washed in the flowing waters of the Holy Spirit, which gives us the words of God's justice rolling down the mountains.

We are people of transformative love charged with confronting hate and sin in all its forms, including the resurgence of racism and bigotry being promoted by white nationalists who no longer hide under hoods and the cover of night. Christ grants us a new life that is set free from the powers of death, however it may be carried and thrown at God's people. Jesus walks with us into the valleys we want to avoid so that we can deliver a word of hope and peace.

I feel ill equipped to stand against this tide of hate. You may feel the same. However, I am compelled by Christ to remember that any struggle that could come to pass is nothing that can be compared to the violence, terror, suffering, and death that has been brought upon our African American brothers and sisters for over 350 years in this nation.

I am compelled by Christ to remember that I made public promises at my baptism. Many of us in the Lutheran church made promises to uphold God's peace and justice in our community. We have incredible power and influence through Christ's life giving waters.

We have children in our arms who deserve to hear a word that defies these hateful words. We have friends and neighbors down our streets who deserve to know that they are welcome and safe in this house of God. Because they are. Our families, our youth, our African American brothers and sisters deserve to know that their lives matter in the presence of Christ. Racist words do not deserve the breath they are given.

Jesus has already destroyed the power of sin through the cross. Our call is to publicly uphold this promise and reflect this light through our lives and actions. We don't have a choice anymore. Racism and the people who brandish it cannot have the final word. Christ will lead us by his way of peace. It is our way to follow him, to defy hate with divine love, to teach his words of compassion to every generation, and to lift high the cross that bears our hope for God's people. Trust in God's Grace.



Trinity Women's Groups are Collecting Items for School Kits

The kits are sent to Lutheran World Relief to distribute to those in need all over the world. The 2017 list of items to be included in the kits are listed below. Marked containers are in narthex & bell tower entrances for your donations. For between \$4 - \$5, one can purchase a complete kit! Monetary donations are also welcome. Please put in an envelope marked LWR School Kits and leave in the church office or place in the offering plate. Any contributions are welcome.

Why school supplies? To the children who receive School Kits, these supplies mean the difference between getting an education or not. Public school is usually free, but in the places where LWR works, even a few required supplies, like pens and paper, may be more than many families can afford.

Last year, our 68 school kits were distributed to El Salvador & Jordan.

Items Needed for Each LWR School Kit:

- *Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide or college ruled paper approx. 8" X 10 1/2"; no loose-leaf paper
 - *One 30 centimeter ruler, or ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
 - *One pencil sharpener
 - *One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
 - *Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
 - *Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
 - *One box of 16 or 24 crayons
 - *One 2 1/2" eraser D
- A Drawstring backpack is provided by Trinity.

Please do NOT donate the following items: any with religious symbols or messages, or decorated with a U.S. Flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to armed forces, including camouflage. (Tiny American flags showing where the items are made are acceptable.)



CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

A summary of the Aug 14, 2017
Church Council Meeting:

- Devotions were from Acts 10:23-28, #seeallthepeople. (UMC online video)
- Pastor reported Karyn Kost will be addressed by the title of Vicar to emphasize her staff position. VBS was a successful endeavor. The first youth group meeting is planned for the end of the month and talks with other churches about the ELCA Youth Gathering will begin. - Finance Committee reported the need to look at insurance with Hollie Guist and Property Committee as well as need to determine renter's insurance reimbursement for intern. Motion passed to split cost of Renter's Insurance with Vicar Karyn for a maximum paid of \$100 by the Church.
- Youth/Education Committee discussed Rally Day and beginning of Sunday school year. Discussed interview questions for Christian Ed. Director position. Will set date to finish organizing Sunday school room and finalize plans for Rally Day.
- Motion passed to limit mileage use to \$500/year for Church Education Director .
- Motion to change format of Committee Night was passed.
- Meeting was adjourned with prayer.

RESPONDING TO GOD

Stewardship. It is a difficult word. Kind of awkward to talk about, and probably the most misunderstood word in our vocabulary. Saying it out loud usually causes one of two responses: groaning or eye rolling. And for most congregations, it means only one thing—from the first week of November until the first Sunday in Advent, the congregation is forced to endure sermons about giving.

Yes, Stewardship, at least in part, has to do with money. But it's so much more than simply coins and greenbacks. It's much, much more than mundane economics. It's our time. It's our gifts and abilities. It's our very lives turned over to God's wisdom. What a gift we have been given to share God's grace in our lives. To pass on God's love and to watch it spread and grow into something we couldn't possibly imagine on our own.

I encourage everyone to check out this space, Responding to God, every month to read a new story about faithful people who have been blessed by God's grace. Some of the stories will be international, some will be local, some may even come from the person you sit next to every week in worship. This space is meant to be a dialogue about Stewardship. It can be an opportunity for us to speak openly, honestly, joyfully about this powerful mark of the church.

Trinity is blessed with a tremendous array of gifts and skills. There is a wealth of opportunity just waiting for us to grasp. I think it's time we brought Stewardship out of the back corner. We should liberate it from its negative image and claim it as a joyous expression of our faith in God.
