Thinking Out Loud With Pastor Josh

“After that I looked, and there was a great crowd that no one could number. There were from every nation, tribe, people, and language...” Revelation 7.9

Question #1 When you gather for worship at Trinity, who do you see?

I will grant as the Pastor, I have the best view in the house. From the front of the worship space, I see all yall. I see your exhaustion from pulling a long shift at work or with the kids. I see you rubbing your forehead or stretching your back when you stand for the gospel reading. I see your unwavering smile and your beaming eyes when you can't help but get out of the aisle and greet all those people.

Who do you see? Do you see the little ones who feel perfectly safe talking to elders by themselves? Do you see our high school youth giggling while they text during a lull in worship? Do you see the couples who always sit together? Do you see the widow, the divorced, the ones perfectly content living on their own?

Who do you see? Because from the front, it's a blessing every week for me to see every generation walking the earth in one room for one hour sharing your lives with each other. Where else in our lives can we consistently experience the wideness of God's human creation? To be invited in, greeted with Christ's Peace, and surrounded with sinner saints just trying to get by like we all do.

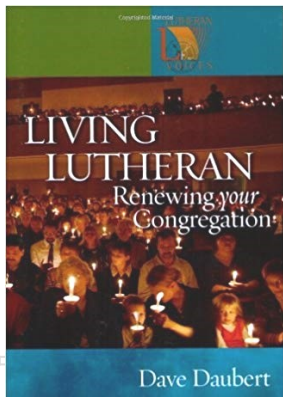
Question #2 When you gather at Trinity, who do you NOT see?

Yeah, I know, such a Pastor question. Any community is inherently exclusive, it is a (tragic) part of our humanity. Though our church may not have hard and fast rules, it is always worth wondering who in our surroundings does not feel welcome or safe among us and why. Who has not been invited? Who does not know our worship times and has not heard that the gospel we cherish is for all people? Who has been turned away, probably without any of us even realizing it happened?

Who is not worshipping among us? The responses always lead to challenging questions. People of color, people of African descent, individuals who (openly) identify LGBTQ+, Latinx neighbors who have immigrated across the border, those for whom English is their second/third/fourth language. What about those who have committed crimes? Or ones who cannot pay their bills? Who do we not see in our midst?

Never is our intent to close the door to our church on anyone. I struggle with these questions as much as you do. With that, I give thanks that Christ gives us a space in which we can love and be loved while asking big questions. And as we ask, may we together continue to be led by Christ into his vision of God's kingdom as we welcome our Lord in the faces and bodies of our neighbors. What a blessing we have to share.

Ask folks while you're standing in line at the grocery store, grabbing coffee or in your backyard. THREE QUESTIONS is meant to be a safe, easy way for any of us to engage our community and gain some ideas on what people are thinking about in Mt Morris and beyond. Feel free to drop off your notes with the office and Council will compile all the information. We can't wait to hear from our neighbors.
