Thinking Out Loud With Pastor Josh

Ever wonder what pastors and rostered ministers talk about when they get together? I'm about to tell ya.

From Sept 16 to Sept 18, I attended the Professional Leaders' Conference (PLC), an annual event hosted by our Northern IL Synod Bishop Jeff Clements. We gathered at the Sinsinawa Mound Center, a convent for the Sinsinawa Dominican Sisters that hosts large group events such as PLC.

It's a beautiful location and I can say that as both a visiting pastor seeking retreat and a local. It happens to be five minutes from my parents' home. Fun fact: I learned how to play piano from a dear sister who was a resident of the Mound. Another fun fact: the hills around the aptly named Mound are excellent for biking.

Why does our synod require this annual gathering? For one, it gets us out of our parishes for a few days. Trust me when I say this, pastors and rostered leaders LOVE our congregations and service sites. It's usually one of the topics we talk about the most. Getting out of the area means we get to swap ideas and gain a few new ones. Though not a vacation since we have intentional learning, gathering times, and worship, it is a time for getting recharged.

Another reason is to learn. Part of our ordination vows we made with the whole church is that we rostered ministers would not stop growing in faith. This means continuing our educations long after seminary is complete. But doing that is tough, so Bishop creates this space of intentional learning so that, at the very least, we have one place to go in the year. By the way, nearly every synod of the ELCA does this and it is one way that our giving to the synod supports the work of the entire Lutheran church by fostering healthy ministers.

But you want to get down to it. What do we really talk about? Besides the sites we serve of course. Well, we talk about our kids if we have them. We talk about our partners if we have them. We ask our Bishop tough questions about job security and sustainability. We share our worries and our hopes for what being a Lutheran church (local and global) will look like in 5 years, 10 years, 50 years. Since this was a Churchwide Assembly year, we talked a bit about the decisions made there and what they mean for us here. We periodically argue about this or that hot church topic, but usually keep it to a light banter.

We pray. A lot. Lots and lots of prayers are given to God in those short three days. We share communion, because the meal is vital for our faith.

Sounds mostly like what we do here at Trinity. We show up as we are, care for each other, worship together, listen and learn from each other, once in a while disagree with each other, and continuously love each other. If for no other reason than because Christ loves us. Maybe hanging at Trinity could be like a retreat for us, a place to be recharged and renewed in our faith.



RESPONDING TO GOD: SHARING OUR GIFTS

Core Values

If you have wandered into Trinity in the past few weeks, you have likely (hopefully) seen the sheets of paper on the walls asking "What Values Should Trinity Reflect?" This is a critical question that Trinity's Council leaders have been asking themselves and we felt it best to be asking as many people as possible the same.

What are Core Values? Plainly stated, Core Values are how a person, community, a family, and a church makes decisions. They are the sometimes spoken, collectively agreed upon ideals and hopes that guide people in a direction. Here's a basic example:

A family decides that one of their priorities (values) will be eating together for the evening meal as many nights as possible. In this decision is a core value of togetherness or solidarity or emotional support. Because of this decision rooted in this value, some nights the family might not eat until 8pm, other nights they might have to eat at 4:30pm. Since the value is that time together as a family around a shared meal, the family chooses to adjust their schedulesmaybe even nightly-to make that happen.

Core Values are about who we are AND they are about where we want to be as a community of Christ. That means they need to be forward looking, and because we are a church rooted in our faith in Christ, they need to reflect how we are going to live out our faith in our community, our homes, our school district, and our Lutheran synod.

Trinity is a church that is Called to Grow and Sent to Serve. The question becomes, what can that look like and how will we follow Christ into this mission? Identifying our Core Values will give our leadership some insight and guidance for how to pursue this blessed work.

- Present slate of candidates to Council no later than January Council meeting

AUDIT COMMITTEE:

The Audit committee will:

- Be three (3) voting members elected by the Congregation Council.
- Will not be members of the Congregation Council nor members of the Finance Committee.
- Be responsible to conduct an examination and review of all congregational financial records, including all established funds, to assure that such records fairly represent the financial condition of the church.
- Submit the findings of the audit to the Church Council and these findings shall be documented in the Annual Report of the Congregation.


