

Thinking Out Loud With Pastor Josh

Welcome to November, friends. This is an action packed month for us at Trinity, full of deep, resounding themes that cut to the core of our identity as people of God.

In this one month at worship we will be thinking about: death, loved ones, distance from God, generosity of God, our own generosity toward our neighbors and God, family meals (and all those family dynamics of dysfunction), community and our place in it (do we have a place in it?), what it means to call Christ our King.

At Trinity we don't shy away from the tough topics and each of these is fraught with all the stuff we carry. Which might be why we humans don't talk about some of these facts of life much in our daily lives. It might be why we get a little queasy thinking that we'll have to encounter these topics if we wander into worship.

We may have a hope or vision of worshipping Christ as a perpetually joyful, praised-filled, feel good event. And to an extent, it is. We give our praise to God every single time we're together because God is our glory and because we are saved by Grace, not our own doing. We cannot save ourselves, but Christ loves us so dearly that Jesus will do whatever it takes to set us free and bind us to God forever.

Within that praise is a myriad of other emotions and realities. As we give thanks for life that liberates us, we remember our beloveds who are bound in sickness, bound to their homes, bound to economic systems that steal energy and hope, bound to class systems designed to keep us "in our place," bound to systems of race/gender/orientation that tell us who we "are" while denying that we are first and forever a child of God.

As we talk about life in Christ, we at Trinity do not stop missing our loved ones who died. Sure, ya, they are at rest, but we aren't. So we sing our praise to God, even through our tears. And we remember all that God has given us as we wrestle with how to give our lives back to God the ways our loved ones did. Which means talking about giving money, giving time, giving our skills and passions to God who loves us so our neighbors and communities across the globe will know the liberating love that shapes us.

As we give thanks for God's generosity and our ability to share a meal with others, some of us will not at all be looking forward to seeing their family. Some of us have needed to create distance and physical space from our blood relatives. Some of us will be eating alone on a national day of feasting and merriment. We stand with each other and remind each other that, in this house, we stand together as Christ our King holds us together.

And I won't even get into all the kingly language and reflecting on where we place our hopes for our daily lives. That gets its own weekend. All of this is a lot of terrain to cover in one month. With that, we never do it alone. Christ is forever leading us, loving us, encouraging us to be direct and honest about who we are in order to give thanks for the ways Christ remains. We create a safe space at Trinity in order for each of us to be with God since, as we proclaim and praise every week, God is here with us.

Next month we will draft 5 Core Values for congregational review. These Core Values will be used going forward to guide our decision making around budgets, ministry needs, and how we will speak, sing and live out the gospel of Christ as an ELCA Lutheran congregation planted at Brayton and Ogle.

RESPONDING TO GOD: SHARING OUR GIFTS

Core Values

Friends, we take time every November to speak honestly and directly about financial giving at Trinity. We all know that our ministries are led by Christ and inspired by the Holy Spirit. We are a church centered on the message of Resurrection and this fuels our hope and passion to share God's promise of Grace with everyone we meet.



We also know that our ministries, our safe building, our weekly worship, and the countless ways we engage our community and world have real, financial costs. It is why we take time every year at our Annual Gathering to discuss and approval our operating budget. How we utilize our funds reflects directly where our priorities are and where we want our congregation to be following Christ.

This year we are asking you, dear friend, to prayerfully consider increasing your financial offering to Trinity. Though there is typically an implication of growing our gifts annually, for our 2020 Budget the leadership of Trinity is being direct and clear. If every person who has given anything to our ministries were to increase their annual giving by 10%, we will be able to continue to provide ALL of the dynamic, inspiring ministries that we have known. For some of us, a 10% increase is not too much, an extra cup of coffee or two a week. For others of us, 10% is a bigger amount, a meal or two a week at a restaurant. The point is not the actual dollar amount, because we know you already have been generous. As our seasons change at Trinity and our identity in Christ shifts over time, we are asking that our giving continue to reflect this movement and growth as well.

Friends, please consider participating in this spiritual practice:

REFLECT – Take time to remember how much God loves you. Think of a time or two where you have seen this love expressed through your family, your community, your church. Whether you're in worship on a regular basis or you hang out with Trinity through social media posts and reading the Tidings, you are part of our community. Where have you seen God?

PRAY – As people of God, we express our faith through prayer. Give your questions to God. Hand over your fears, speak your worries and joys, give thanks that Christ listens and responds. Consider praying specifically with your checkbook or device in your hand, asking God how the resources you have access to might reflect God's glory in your community and world.

 \mathbf{GIVE} – We are invited to give to God because God has given us all we need. Financial giving is part of our faithful response to the love and mercy Christ grants us. If you have made an offering to Trinity this year, consider increasing the amount by 10% for 2020. If you have not had the opportunity to give a monetary gift before, maybe this is the time you will be able. However you choose to share your resources, thank you for being involved in the life of Trinity Lutheran Church.

Pr Josh will walk us through a "typical" planning meeting, offer some tips, provide a couple of resources, and help us to see that its not a bad omen to talk openly with our loved ones about our hopes for the funeral after we have died.

BVS TRAINEES VOLUNTEER!



On Oct. 2nd, four young women stopped in eagerly offering to help for a few hours as part of their three week training at Camp Emmaus for a year long commitment to Brethren Volunteer Service. After training, they were assigned to communities across the country as well as abroad. (One knew she was going to Ireland to work with disadvantaged youth.)

We put them to work filling all 118 pew racks with visitor cards, paper for writing notes, etc. (thanks to Betty Ford, who faithfully does this and our YC group for adding the Prayer cards) Then, they found brooms & cleaned the pew cushions & returned stray Legos & crayons to their bags. It was a joy to have them!

LOMC currently has a seminarian on staff who spent last year in Hungary through Young Adults in Global Missions, an ELCA Global Missions program that sends young adults ages 21-29 on mission trips.

- Be responsible to conduct an examination and review of all congregational financial records, including all established funds, to assure that such records fairly represent the financial condition of the church.
- Submit the findings of the audit to the Church Council and these findings shall be documented in the Annual Report of the Congregation.
