Thinking Out Loud With Pastor Josh

If you read my newsletter post from January (I'll give you a second to grab it, I'm sure it there on the fridge), or you've spent more than 5 minutes around me, you'll know that I like to think up wacky ideas. I tend to have more questions than answers, more thoughts and than concrete solutions.

I have another one: what if we all, as in all of us at Trinity, read a book together? For Lent.

Okay, let's do it!

The book is <u>Unafraid</u>: <u>Living with Courage and Hope in Uncertain Times</u>, by Adam Hamilton. Hamilton is a Methodist pastor who is also a prolific writer with an uncanny sense that churches like to study and talk about topics during the season of Lent. Thus, this particular book is broken into five sections to match the five weekends and midweek services of Lent when we can get together to study and have talk. He also, in his uncanny marketing wisdom, puts out DVDs that match the sections and help build on the theme of the series.

And every single book I've read and led from Pr Hamilton is great. He is the living example of the adage, why reinvent the wheel when a pastor somewhere else has the time and skill to craft an excellent one? BTW, these are the five sections he covers:

- 1. Understanding and Countering Fear
- 2. Crime, Race, Terrorism, and Politics
- 3. Failure, Disappointing Others, Insignificance, and Loneliness
- 4. Apocalypse, Change, Missing Out, and Finances
- 5. Aging, Illness, Dying, and Fear of the Lord

These are so good. We could spend weeks on each one. But we won't, one week each.

Here's the really wacky part. We will do this group study multiple ways. For one, we'll use those Sundays after worship in Lent to dig into the sections. We will also use our midweek worship times to reflect on the sections. I am also proposing a book club to digest some of these materials. Meet up at a host's home and share our wisdom outside of the church. We could easily have several short term book groups going.

Ordering the book is easy, its on Amazon and elsewhere (cheap plug to use AmazonSmile and note Trinity Lutheran Church). If you're a Kindle user, its \$4.99, hardcovers are \$16.50. We will put together an order list in the office during February. I will put out a sign up for the book club(s) and start asking around.

I know, this is crazy. All of us studying and thinking and praying together as one body. I hope you are able to join this Lenten conversation as part of our *City on a Hill*.

BUILDING FIRE RESPONSE KITS

For Mt Morris Fire Department

Kendra Ehrler and Pr Josh are building fire response kits for the Mt Morris Fire Department. Each kit is designed to aid an individual or family displaced from their home due to fire or crisis. The plan is to use a Thrivent Action Grant to buy much of these supplies in bulk to ensure sameness (particularly the backpacks). Once the supplies are gathered, folks will be invited to help assemble the kits. Thanks for your support.

Each kit will contain: backpack, fleece blanket, bar soap, travel size laundry soap, bottle of water, toothbrush, travel size toothpaste, hair brush, socks, roll of quarters, \$40 Walmart card, knit hat, notepad/pen, small stuffed critter, and fire booklet from the fire department. Talk to Kendra to find out how these kits are coming along and if anything is still needed.
