His Excellency Mr. Kim Jong-un,

I am extremely blissful that the first set of peace talks between the government of the United States and the government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea was a success. As I have always been extremely confident that such peace talks were extremely needed between the United States and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, I am extremely blissful that such peace talks occurred despite some individuals in my world disbelieving that such peace talks would occur. I was extremely worried that a war could have broken out between the United States and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea prior to the election of President Moon Jae-in of South Korea and due to hostility between the United States and South Korea against the Democratic People's Republic of Korea. That is why I wanted to express my views with you on different issues as well as my want for peace talks to occur. Some individuals in my world do not see a point in the government of the United States and the government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea having such peace talks due to concerns over the fruitfulness of the peace talks and whether or not all parties are going to abide by the terms and the conditions of the mutually agreed to compromise. Some individuals believe that the government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea is going to hide its nuclear weapons, in and out of inspection time, as well as continue to pursue nuclear weapons. The government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea seems to be skeptical over the urgent need and want for nuclear weapons in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea to be destroyed, without more of word assurances as to protecting its security concerns.<sup>1</sup> While I certainly have different opinions on this issue and while I am



Prime Minister Abe is putting pressure on the President of the United States to address the missing Japanese citizens with you, since it does appear that is a strong foreign policy objective of the government of Japan in engaging in negotiations with you. Japan has been asserted to have done things that have totally angered officials with the government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea as well. So, I do believe that when peace talks occur in the future between the government of Japan and the government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, things that both countries have done against one another that has angered the other country does need to be addressed, in a way that is respectful, fair and just.
