But I feel it has been overlooked and should be addressed sooner than later.

Tips from the Pro

As we move into 2018, I would like to encourage more participation in tournaments, more fun social events and any "outside of the box" ideas for member outings, i.e. a Cold Springs bowling league, poker games, camping trips, etc. Happy holidays to all and we hope to see you soon!!

"Focus on your finish Part II."

One thing I notice is many golfers do not have a good finish position after striking the golf ball. Why is a "good" finish important anyway? We have already struck the golf ball long before we reach our finish position haven't we?

Yes, that is true. However, a good finish is important because in order to get to a good finish you most likely need to be at a good impact position. If you have a bad finish you more than likely have a bad impact position.

Ever notice how tour professionals all have their right heel off the ground at impact? This is because from the start of the downswing they are already rotating toward the target trying to get their weight on the left side as quickly as possible. One easy way to focus on our finish is to try and touch your knees together at your finish. Unless you have transferred your weight to the left side this is impossible.

This is all in an effort to get our hands "ahead" of the golf ball at impact, creating that descending blow while compressing the golf ball ... in other words, EFFORTLESS POWER!
