Presidents Message - Brett Robinson

Fellow members,

Thank you very much for your participation if you were among those who cast your vote in January. If for whatever reason you were unable to participate, please accept my apologies for not providing the informational material in a timely manner or for not explaining the issues at hand clearly enough to prompt you to take part.

The results of the ballot were not in favor of a dues increase by a narrow margin of 60 percent in favor -40 percent opposed. This means that we have to adjust our business model as a club to accommodate the rising cost of doing business by getting leaner in our expenditures. Please watch for updates and notices as necessary.

I felt moved to include my personal thoughts for what they are worth. Let me know yours when you see me in the bar at the course.

Brett's Rant

In a recent discussion with a good friend of mine, we debated our beliefs about what membership is and is not. We both agreed that as proprietary members we should all share in the benefits of the club and in turn, we should share in the costs of the club.

From there our opinions went in opposing directions for a brief time. For example, the "**mill river program**". This was put into place initially to allow our pro shop to have available golf items for sale with a reasonable selection of inventory - a cost borne by some, but not all of the membership.

Next, **driving range passes**, where range balls are provided in an unlimited amount for our members to practice as often and whenever they choose - a cost borne by some, but not all of the membership.

Next, the **cart fleet**, where a specific number of uses is available for various levels of monthly fees - a cost borne by some, but not all of the membership.

Finally, **trail fees**, where owners of private carts pay a fee that was to initially offset the cost of improving our cart paths from pavement to concrete - a cost borne by some, but not all of the membership. (That is kind of a stretch, but the same principal).

January finally brought some rain back to the course but more importantly, some snow to the mountains. Not only does it affect the amount of water we have to irrigate with, it also improves the quality of water.

Unfortunately, it does not take much rain now to put us on cart paths. Depending on the amount of rainfall, it usually takes three to four days to be able to drive on the fairways. Holes 9,14,15, 16 and 18 are the last ones to drain. Carts have to remain on the paths longer on those particular holes. Please check with the pro shop after every rain event for information about driving on the fairways.

Even the cool season grasses are not growing much now because of the cold temperatures so we don't have to worry too much about falling behind when it is too wet to mow. That will soon be a different story now that the days are starting to get longer and we head toward warmer months.

Winter snow mold disease has not been too much of an issue on the greens. The newly seeded areas around the second green and its bunkers are slowly filling in. I knew it was going to be a challenge getting any grass seed to grow, but we are farther along than I thought we would be.

As for other projects that we have been trying to fit in through the winter months – we built a new bunker on No. 5 and we are also working on finishing some grading around the 17 and 18th tees to help with some drainage issues as well as add some landscape work.

The automatic frost delays end Feb. 16 but don't be surprised if we still have delays through April. We will either call for a shotgun or delayed tee time start.

One of the most common mistakes made by golfers is how to proceed after a ball has entered into a yellow or red-staked hazard. I will quickly define the difference between the two

Yellow stake: A water hazard is typically found to be directly in front of a playing surface and normally requires a player to carry this type of hazard to reach the fairway or green.

Red stake: A lateral water hazard is typically found to be left or right of the playing surface - i.e. the fairway or green.

Refer to Rule 26-1 Water Hazards (Including Lateral Water Hazards) in your USGA The Rules of Golf book as a reference

How to proceed

:

If a ball is found in a water hazard or if it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found is in the water hazard (whether the ball lies in water or not), the player may under penalty of one stroke:

1. Play a ball under the stroke and distance provision by dropping at the point where the player's last stroke was played (20-5) - with the option to re-tee if the player was on the tee box


2. Drop the ball behind the water hazard, keeping that point at which the original ball last crossed the margin of the water hazard directly between the hole and the spot on which the ball is dropped, with no limit to how far behind the water hazard the ball may be dropped.

3. An additional option is available only when a ball has entered into a lateral water hazard marked with a RED line or stake.

A player may advance by identifying the point where the ball last crossed the lateral water hazard. From this point the ball can be dropped using two-club lengths

equal distance or no closer to the hole. In some cases that hazard can be taken out of play.

(Point D). Refer to the Lateral Water Hazard Diagram for clarification.
