Greetings all. It is raining as I write this article and what a difference a year makes! A year ago we wanted the rain to stop so we could enjoy the course. This year we are praying for more rain and snow.

This month I intend to spend the 500 or so words I am allotted to talk a little about marketing. Here it goes ... and let's start on the membership front. The club is in need of new members. We have had quite a few take advantage of the buyout option, some for personal reasons, some because they've moved out of the area and others for health issues.

The club is trying to do something about this including marketing to golfers in the area to let them know of our VALUE! Even with any price increases needed as we move forward in 2018, a Cold Springs membership will be less than half the cost of many other clubs.

Here is a list of clubs in the area (with names coded to protect the innocent) and their monthly dues ... per month!

A) Club S = \$700 D) Club G = \$600

B) Club D = \$690 E) Club N = \$525

C) Club C = \$590 F) Club R = \$550

So this will be our message to the golfers in the area. If a family plays just four times per month it would realize the value.

So why don't more golfers join Cold Springs? The issue is complex for sure. Location is a factor. Long term contracts may be another reason. The major one, in many industry veterans' opinion, is family time constraints. Our society has changed and we need both family decision makers to play golf or at least both to be interested and want to get into the game.

The long term good news is this! In the history of golf there have never been so many ladies and juniors starting to play the game. The bad news is there will be a lag of at least a few years until they feel they have reached a skill level or economic position to think about joining a golf club. The learning curve for golf is long. It just is. Some people get the bug and start playing a lot right away, but they are the exception.

So without beating this dead horse too much, we at Cold Springs know we are a great deal and located in an environment that few course can match. We will continue to improve our main product - the course. But we can use your help. Let's all reach out to friends and other family members and ask them to consider joining.

Listen to their reasons about why it might not work for them and hopefully we can come up with programs that will prove to be win-win solutions for both the potential members and our club. Like Michael Breed says ... "let's do this!"

So from a macro standpoint, when the high schools start filling up again, when housing starts get going in the area again, when traffic becomes a little more congested everywhere else ... Cold Springs will be positioned just right to take advantage of these new golfers.

Goose Control by Tom Hazlett

Over the past several years the club has employed the use of dogs in an attempt to control the number of geese that want to make Cold Springs their habitat. Prior to that time numerous attempts were made to address this issue. Among these attempts were fake alligators in the ponds, cut-outs of coyotes, noise makers and model motor boats in the ponds. Had drones existed at the time I'm sure that we would have deployed them as well.

Why do we want to minimize the goose population? Aside from being unsightly, goose excrement poses a health hazard to the membership. Geese are capable of transmitting diseases to humans. The average Canadian Goose consumes 4 lbs of grass and excretes 3 lbs per day. Some quick math results in each goose depositing nearly 1100 lbs of excrement per year. That is over 1 ton of excrement per pair of geese!!!

The Department of Fish and Game was contacted and they recommended the use of dogs to "Hassle" the Geese in order to discourage them from nesting on our golf course. In cooperation between the Green Committee and the Board of Directors a program was put into place which allows members/staff and their dogs (which have been approved) to be taken out onto the course and to chase the geese away. Today, Cold Springs enjoys a considerably smaller goose population than many of our neighbors.

The weather was a little backward in February ... from warm afternoons at the beginning of the month to cold days at the end of the month.

The course was getting pretty dry, so it was good to finally get some moisture at the end of February. Getting sufficient rain through winter into spring means delaying irrigation pumping, which in turn means lower pump electricity costs. Hopefully, we will get some more rain events spread throughout the coming months, especially since we are currently at less than half of a season average of rainfall total.

We have been working on some small projects throughout the course while it has been cold and dry. The new bunker on No. 5 was finished. We have been working on several things on the No. 17 tee. We did some grading on the left side and added soil around the forward and middle tee boxes to alleviate some issues that arise when it gets really wet there as well as ease the slope to walk up onto the forward tee.

We took down the mound for the old tee box on the right of the cart path that was no longer in use and repositioned the sign to face the green. We will be doing a landscape feature through there with a drop area at the forward edge.

We started installing a drain line on the back left side of the No. 6 green, as we continue to address drainage issues that we can finish fairly quickly. If the weather continues to be either too cold or too wet, we plan to cut back the over growth from trees and shrubs along the creek bank on 13. This will help ease the shading and wet conditions on the left side of the fairway and rough.

Greens aeration is still scheduled for March 19-20, weather permitting. We are working out the method we are going to use depending on resources available.
