This needs to end somehow. The solution has yet to be determined. It continues to be a point of discussion and a priority moving forward.

We also recently held a meeting to reinstate our corporate memberships. Thank you to all who attended this meeting and took part in the process.

Please come out and enjoy the summer weather. Play a leisurely round of golf with your friends at the club. Enjoy a refreshing adult beverage and let the memories begin.

Greetings golfers ... both new and veterans alike.

We have had quite a few new members join our ranks. (If you think I am talking about you ... then I probably am.)

Because we have so many new players, we have revived the IAG (men) and started a new Fun Bunch (ladies) for the Saturdays mornings when there are no scheduled tournaments.

At the time of this writing we have one under our belt after kicking off this new format on Memorial Day. A modest entry fee will be charged with no pressure to dwell on your score. The only pressure will be to have some fun and indulge in some trash talking with your friends.

Check in with the Pro Shop and let the starter know you want to participate, pay the entry and you will be paired and given a tee time. The tournament times will start at 9:30 a.m.

Here is another new fun thing we are going to try. The golf shop will be instituting a caddie-for-a-day program ... you can request any one of our pros to play either 9 or 18 holes with your group.

This is called the "Tour Caddie Program." It involves learning how the tour players deliberately and strategically manage their game under so much pressure. It is not a swing instruction day, but hopefully learning how YOU can improve your scores and understand the game a little better. You just might learn a trick shot or two along the way.

We plan on training the staff in both the format and topics in the coming weeks, with a tentative first day target of taking signups for June 11. The Pro Shop will schedule these just like tee times (one week in advance) and will schedule a rotation of pros to participate

The pros will take signups for three players to participate on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Saturdays ... at least two days per month.

I believe we are all capable of improving at least one facet of the game every year.

I know I have done it over the last year ... my dreaded putting is now a strength and it had nothing to do with mechanics. Stay tuned!

Clubhouse update: The event center table tops are on order, and will ship June 4. We hope to have them installed by the ladies invitational. Fingers crossed!

Pro-Shots - Brian Fuentes

There's one simple fact about shot shape: On the road you take to playing good golf, nowhere is there a slice. You can go from hooking to good golf, but if you don't learn how to stop hitting shots with an open clubface, you won't get very far.

The unfortunate reality is that a large majority of players, possibly 90 percent, struggle with a slice. They don't have a good grip, they make a steep swing into the ball, and they don't understand how the hands work in a good release. Those things combine to produce high, weak shots to the right

GET A DRIVER THAT'S FIT FOR THE JOB

Before you make your first practice swing, you need to evaluate your equipment. Almost all slicers use a driver with too little loft because they're reacting to their high, weak ball flight. The new adjustable drivers let you increase the loft and move weight to the club head's heel. Instead of swinging a 9-degree driver and making it 10 or 11 degrees because you hold it open through impact, you want more loft so you can release your hands and turn a 10.5 driver into a 9.

SET YOUR HANDS SO THEY CAN RELEASE

Two grip mistakes make a slice almost inevitable. Many players use a grip that's too weak -- with the thumbs pointing straight down the handle. Make your grip stronger (*right*), so your hands are turned away from the target and your palms are parallel with each other. If you drew lines up from the base of your thumbs, they should hit the point of your collar on the right side of your shirt. In addition, gripping too tightly keeps the hands from releasing through impact. Take a soft grip.

May was definitely a busy month as we worked to ensure all the detail areas were in shape for the men's invitational. Crew issues made it more challenging. Unfortunately we received the sad news that one of our employee's daughter came down with pneumonia and passed away the week prior to the invitational. Another employee missed time as he dealt with a foot injury.

Thankfully, the May weather was on the cool side. I am sure that will change quickly as we dive into summer. So far we've had no major irrigation issues such as pumps shutting down and the neverending minor electrical glitches in the field controllers. But it is still early. Wait until the first heat wave.

We have had to get into our diversion point in the creek to clear out gravel and large rock that washed up along the dam and blocked our intake point. While I am on the subject of water diversion by the end of June we have to submit our water diversion reports to the water resource control board. To update you on our 2017 amounts ... we diverted a little over half of our 500 acre feet we are allotted per year.

To try and clean up the amount of annual Bluegrass seed heads/flowers on the greens we have been doing a lot of verti-cutting, grooming and topdressing. The past few weeks we have been battling some brown ring patch and fairy ring on the greens. Several fungicide applications in conjunction with spike venting and possibly another small coring aeration later this month will help knock it down and get us through. We will try to get in fairway aeration this month.

Other than that, not much else is planned except for keeping up with all the nut sedge weeds that have taken off, as well as keeping up with irrigation issues.

Fairways & Greens – Jeff O'Donnell

The course is in the best shape ever. I hope you are all enjoying it.

It was sad to see watch the big pine tree on No. 10 finally die and have to be removed. There are no plans to plant a new tree or add a bunker. Just enjoy playing this great hole.

Here are a few housekeeping ideas to help keep course looking and playing its best. Park carts on the cart path as you go to the greens. Try to avoid wet areas.

Repair ball marks on the greens. An unrepaired ball mark takes about two weeks to fill back in. A properly repaired ball mark takes about two to three days to grow back in perfectly. Push the repair tool or a simple tee into the mark, pull toward the center all the way around and finish by tapping the area down with your putter.

Replace divots on the fairways and rough if they have dirt covering the roots. If not, fill the hole with sand. Less is better. Do not mound or over fill.

Every course asks that bunker rakes be replaced their own way. Our preferred way is to place the rake (after you have smoothed your divot and foot prints) in the sand with the handle lying on the grass 6 inches or so. Please don't leave a long length of the rake handle sticking up in such a way that a golfer's ball might hit it.

If you leave a few inches lying on the grass the next person does not have to walk into the bunker to retrieve the rake. Please knock the sand off your feet before walking onto the green.

These things will help us keep our wonderful course in good condition for all of us to enjoy.
