Last month I hit you with a bunch of new or different rules that the USGA will be instituting in January, 2019 ... geez it is hard to say that!

This month I plan on taking a complete 180 turn and promote more fun. Take a look and see if we/us/you can use some of these fun suggestions this winter to help new golfers take up this great game. Of course these will not be applicable during tournaments ... or posting legitimate golf scores.

- It's okay to not keep score when you are learning!
- It's okay to play from the shortest tees or start at the 150 yard marker.
- It's okay to give yourself a better lie by rolling the ball around a little. It's okay to tee the ball up anywhere when you are first learning.
- It's okay to only count swings when you make contact with the ball.
- It's okay to throw the ball out of a bunker after one try.
- It's okay to forget about a ball that may be lost or out of bounds. It's okay to drop a ball where you think it might be ... or where you wanted it to be.
- It's okay to play a scramble with your group.
- It's okay to just chip and putt on a hole when you feel like it.
- It's okay to pick up in the middle of the hole and enjoy the outdoors.
- It's okay to skip a hole if you need to take a break.
- It's okay to play less than 9 or 18 holes and call it a round of golf.
- It's okay to move your ball away from trees, rocks or very hilly lies.
- It's okay to hit the same club for the entire round, while using a putter on the putting green.
- It's okay to play golf in your sneakers. Be comfortable!
- It's okay to get enthusiastic! (High fives, fist pumps and big smiles are encouraged.)
- It's okay to talk on the golf course ... enjoy a nice conversation or tell a few jokes. Maybe some trash talking?
- It's okay to bring your kids to the course, whether they are 5 or 35.
- It's okay to PLAY GOLF JUST FOR FUN!

If each one of us persuades one new player to start playing golf ... we will have at least one more person to laugh and make fun of! (Just kidding of course ... maybe?)

Rules of golf – The rules of golf can sometimes be a little overwhelming for golfers.

However, I do feel it is important that all golfers should carry the rules of golf book in their golf bags. Every four years the USGA will analyze and review any rules that should be amended or, in some rare occasions, be completely eradicated from the rules book entirely. Here are a few rule changes which will occur during the next book revision January, 2019.

Talkin Turf - *Doug Jeffrey*

With the continuation of the mild warm weather the greens grew in fairly quickly after aeration. The additional applications of sand to smooth greens out from aeration presented challenges such as dealing with rapid wear down of the cutting unit from the sand as well as keeping up with the growth of grass.

The summer stress areas are growing in with the help of manual spiking and seeding of new bent grass. Tee over-seeding went well, with a process of verti-cutting/thatching the tee box, mowing it down, spreading seed and then topdressing with a divot mix. We had quick germination and growth with the warm weather.

Fall leave drop is really starting to take off. Every morning there is a number of greens that have to be blown before we mow. We have started on some small projects such as trying to correct some chronic poor soft drainage areas by filling in the low areas and installing new drain lines if needed.

Don't let the warm weather fool you. We are heading toward winter and have already had some frost conditions with temperatures dipping into the low 30's. The warm season weeds and grasses have started going dormant.

Just a reminder: as the automatic full course frost delay begins, the length of the delay depends on the severity of the temperature and sunrise. It is best to call the frost line, 530 622-5330, the mornings you plan to golf for updates.
