New Rule Changes Effective Jan. 1, 2019

- <u>Dropping procedure:</u> When taking relief (from an abnormal course condition or penalty area, for example), golfers will now drop from knee height. This will ensure consistency and simplicity in the dropping process while also preserving the randomness of the drop. (Key change: the proposed Rules released in 2017 suggested dropping from any height).
- Removing the penalty for a double hit: The penalty stroke for accidentally striking the ball more than once in the course of a stroke has been removed. Golfers will simply count the one stroke they made to strike the ball. (Key change: the proposed Rules released in 2017 retained the existing one-stroke penalty).

All Cold Springs Tournament Committees are meeting to discuss the following local rule:

• Balls Lost or Out of Bounds: Alternative to Stroke and Distance: A new Local Rule will now be available in January 2019, permitting the committees to allow golfers the option to drop the ball in the vicinity of where the ball is lost or out of bounds (including the nearest fairway area), under a two-stroke penalty. It addresses concerns raised at the club level about the negative impact on pace of play when a player is required to go back under stroke and distance. The Local Rule is not intended for higher levels of play, such as professional or elite level competitions. (Key change: this is a new addition to support pace of play)

Tips to Hitting it Better

The one piece takeaway: "Push" the club straight back. Picture a wall running parallel to your toe line and straight up through your hands. As you start your swing, keep your hands and the club head on the wall.

Left knee is the key: To hit solid irons, unwind your rotation from the top of the swing. To do this, try bumping your right knee into your left knee at impact. This gets your energy and swing power moving in the direction of the hit so you leave nothing behind.

Wedge it close: Move your body and arms as a single unit. This turns your normal power swing into a control swing, and control is far more important than power from short range. Here's a visual that will help: At address, your shoulders and arms form a triangle in front of your chest.

Your goal? Keep the triangle intact and in front of your chest from start to finish. It helps to swing with "dead arms" and use your torso, not your legs, as the engine of your swing. I like to tell my students to wedge it with their "core" instead of their hands.

Talkin Turf - Doug Jeffrey

The early cold in November quickly sent the warm season turf like Bermuda grass into dormancy. We finally got some rain, but with that came conditions for winter diseases such as snow mold. We have a few initial break-out spots and are trying to hold it in check.

Once we hit our saturation point from the rain it usually takes a week or more to drain enough so we can get out and mow any grass growth in the fairways and roughs without making too much of a mess. That's usually the time it takes to get carts back on the cart paths as well.

We cleaned up most of the leaf debris by the end of December. The rain encouraged a quick germination of the grass seed spread on projects around the Nos. 8 and 17 greens and we finished the grading and drainage work near the first tee and the practice greens.

The grade around the bunker on No. 5 was raised to reduce the potential for rain wash out. A large drain line was uncovered at the edge of the ninth fairway that had deteriorated. We are working on getting new pipe in to replace it with the ability to add future lines to it.

Winter weather and our reduced crew size are going to limit work on projects but we would like to start some bunker renovation, as well as take care of some chronic soft spot problem areas.
