No activity this month...too much rain!

Talkin Turf - *Doug Jeffrey*

For the past 10 years February on average has been our second wettest month behind March. But we have had more than 10 inches of rain this month as of the last week of February. I wasn't expecting it to also be our coldest month of the winter.

The combination of saturated soils and high winds knocked down a few trees... it was not a surprise that some came down. The last one was a large pine that fell with a little help from some snow and took down the power lines leading to the maintenance facility.

Some of the storm waves that came through dumped a lot rain in short periods of time, causing a lot of washouts. The drain area off No. 16 that washed out last March was flushed out again, sending a lot of the soil onto the 16th fairway. With so much spring water flowing through the course it will be awhile before we can get out to some areas.

We did start on a project around the No. 8 green. We are installing drainage through the approach to alleviate the saturation there. Right now it is just a thick layer of sod on top of very hard soil.

We are also doing a little renovation on the bunker: cutting new edges and returning to old ones as well as raising the bottom so it can drain better. Unfortunately, we have a tree at the front edge of the fairway that blocks the view of the bunker.

Aeration is again planned for the end of the month. We will be doing a core aeration this spring.
