Pastor's Corner: Resurrection at Urban Ministry

"If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you."

(Romans 8:11)

Easter is coming. It is a time when we celebrate the resurrection of Christ. The time is not complete unless we take joy in the new life given to us by Jesus Christ.

And it is not complete without our heartfelt thanks for the gift He has given us. We need to remind ourselves of this daily, for it is our plight to fall back into our old, human ways. The day-to-day life, so familiar and comfortable to us, can make us forget who we are: blessed children of God.

In this season, I am reminded of a friend who touched me deeply when I was a preacher at Greensboro Urban Ministry noontime worship services. His name was Fred, and he had a special place in my heart.

I remember especially one day... it was a cold Thursday in mid-February, and I'd burst through the doors to the lunchroom, announcing the beginning of midday worship.

Slowly, deliberately, my friends made their way into the worship room. After warm greetings, all 16 of us joined in the singing of *Amazing Grace*. My homeless friends knew each word by heart.

I looked around and my heart sank. Fred's seat was empty.

The week before, I'd worshipped with Fred and something had changed. We shook hands, but he would get no closer than arm's length.

His skin, normally the color of fine walnut, had lost its radiant glow... giving way to an ashen-like quality that hinted at dwindling days. His smile was hidden behind two tightly closed lips.

And the eyes... the laughing, glowing, heart revealing onyx gems of eyes... they were covered with the tell-tale gauze. Their gaze was fixed on me, but the stare was straight through me, into that other world of drug-induced delirium.

And now, on this day, he was gone. He was somewhere on the street, a lost man of thirty. Money was being paid and drugs were being bought.

The presence of Christ in Fred's heart, a presence that rendered Fred, at once, alive, engaging, thrilled with joy and filled with love, was now but one more thing covered by layers and layers of feel-good-right-now.

But I couldn't dwell on that. The others were in the room, and we worshipped as community.

"Big Man" roared in laughter as he hit a bad note. He shouted, "Amen!" at the end of every line.

Latecia asked when we could talk about Babylon instead of Jesus (one need not speculate too much about her chosen profession).

Grady read his new poem about grace... then, promptly got up and left.

Marion told us about her new apartment, granted through God's grace. We all clapped.

Then there was the proclamation. Today's sermon: *The Lost Sheep*. At sermon's end, we talked, we gathered, we held hands and we prayed, as always.

We prayed this day in thanks that God woke us up. We prayed for food and shelter for all the poor. We prayed for the lost rich, that they would see through the idols of money, power, "success," and the attendant bangles, and come to worship the true Lord, Jesus Christ.

There was no guile, no arrogance, no pride, no hidden agendas; just a circle of people from all walks of life, praying for the world to become the community of Christ.

Weeks passed. And then...
It was that first perfect day in Spring; that day when the air was warm and the sky was Carolina blue and the dogwoods blossomed and, were you still in high school, you'd be absolutely certain that hanging with your pals on a day like this was what heaven was like.

It was Thursday, and that meant another noontime worship. Greetings were shared, and all took their seats. *Amazing Grace* gave way to *A Mighty Fortress*, and on this perfect day given by God, not even the Mormon Tabernacle Choir sounded better than us folks at Urban Ministry.

We prayed. We read Bible verses. Then, the proclamation. The day's sermon: *The Kingdom of God*.

We spoke of time: No, the Kingdom of God is not something far down the road! God is not subject to our timeline... not hardly.

The Kingdom, the *Kingdom*... maybe we get glimpses and slivers even on this day, even there at that moment! Maybe even the joy we felt in that room was a glimpse of the Kingdom.

Maybe the creation; the limbs which, three weeks back, were skinny skeletal fingers, seemingly dead against a cold gray sky and were now bursting with flowers and shoots and buds in a glorious celebration of life... maybe that was a taste of the Kingdom.

And so, filled with joy, we ended with our prayer of thanks. I turned, and in walked Fred. He smiled. His eyes... they *glowed*. He laughed and said, "Thank you, Jesus." He was back, at least for a while. There was hope.

We hugged like brothers separated by years of war. Tears filled our eyes and spilled over.

And nothing has ever smelled so sweet to me as the odor of street stench that permeated Fred's old clothes...
A taste of the Kingdom of Heaven.

Friends, it is almost Easter. The time of resurrection. Let's join together with Fred, and one another, in proclaiming straight from the heart... "Thank you, Jesus."

"I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live." Jesus Christ (John 11:25)

The Personnel Committee would like to share the results of the "Feedback Opportunity" that we extended to the members in attendance during the past several weeks. A two-page form was handed out to approximately 55 members including a few of our young adults. Out of the 55 forms handed out, I received 15 forms back which may seem to be a really low number. Not really when you consider that most people rarely provide feedback when things are going well, most people share their opinion when asked if they are unhappy or things are going well.

Let me go ahead and say, I received NO feedback which indicated that a member was unhappy with the job that Rev Elam doing!

I apologize for the length of this article, but I feel it is necessary to provide as much data as necessary for everyone to get the big picture about what our members shared and what they indicated was most important to them. So, here goes.

There were 10 different topics to be considered, each person was asked to "rank their importance" from 1 to 10 (1 being most important), so that the Personnel Committee could provide this feedback to the Pastor. The thought is that the Pastor only has so many hours in a week to do everything needed, and we need to help him to better understand what WE feel is most important. Here is a list of the way we ranked each topic, these are in order of Most Important to Less important:

- 1. Preaching and Worship Leadership – (26 points) average score 2.0
- 2. Spiritual Maturity (36 points) average score 2.8
- 3. Motivator (54 points) average score 4.2
- 4. Collaboration (56 points) average score 4.3
- 5. Interpersonal Engagement (64 points) average score 4.9
- 6. Teacher (66 points) average score 5.1

- 7. Communicator (67 points) average score 5.1
- 8. Personal Resilience (79 points) average score 6.1
- 9. Willingness to Engage Conflict (84 points) average score 6.5
- 10. Strategy and Vision/Leader of Change (95 points) average score 7.3

Here are the complete descriptions which were provided with each topic:

- Preaching and Worship
 Leadership Is a consistently effective preacher and worship leader, Is able to inspire from the pulpit, communicates a clear and consistent message through sermons that are carefully prepared and artfully delivered, Projects the identity and character of the congregation through worship leadership presence
- Spiritual Maturity Shows strong personal depth and spiritual grounding, Demonstrates integrity by walking the talk and by responding with faithfulness of purpose, Is seen by others as trustworthy and authentic, Nurtures a rich spiritual life, Seeks the wisdom and guidance of appropriate mentors, Is able to articulate a clear and consistent theology
- Motivator Creates and sustains an organizational culture which permits others to provide the quality of service essential to high performance, Enables others to acquire the tools and support they need to perform well, Influences others toward a spirit of service and meaningful contributions to mission accomplishment.

Collaboration - Has a natural orientation toward getting people to work together; Shares wins and successes, Fosters open dialogue; Allows people finish and be responsible for their work, Creates strong feelings of belonging among group members, Is a good judge of talent and can accurately assess the strengths and limitation of others.

Interpersonal Engagement -

Displays a consistent ability to build solid relationships of trust and respect inside and outside of the organization, Engage people, organizations, and delivering results, Use negotiation skills and adaptability to encourage recognition of joint concerns, collaboration, and to influence the success of outcomes

- Teacher Creates learning environments
 where students are active participants as
 Individuals and as members of
 collaborative groups; designs lesson plans
 that teach concepts, facts, and theology;
 effectively uses multiple learning tools to
 reach a wide variety of learners, Revises
 instructional strategies based upon
 ministry/organization context.
- Communicator Advances the abilities of individuals and the organizations through active listening supported with meaningful oral and written presentation of information.
- Personal Resilience Learns from adversity and failure; picks up on the need to change personal, Interpersonal and leadership behaviors, Deals well with ambiguity; Copes effectively with change, Can decide and act without having the total picture; comfortably handles risk and uncertainty; Seeks feedback; Expresses personal regret when appropriate
- Willingness to Engage Conflict Steps up to conflicts, seeing them as
 opportunities; Reads situations quickly,
 Good focused listening; Can identify
 common ground and elicit cooperation from
 others crafting mutual solutions

 Strategy and Vision/leader of Change - Sees ahead clearly, keeping focused on the larger picture; can anticipate future consequences and trends accurately, Is future oriented casts a compelling and inspired vision for a preferred future, Sees possibility, Crafts breakthrough strategies.
