COURSE OBJECTIVE: To give the student an understanding of basic corporate finance; a look into the financial aspects of business.

- Weeks 1 through 3: Chapters 1,3,4. Exam one on Chapters 1,3,4.
- Weeks 4 through 6: Chapters 5,6,7. Exam two on those chapters.
- Weeks 7 through 10: Chapters 8,9,10. Exam three on those chapters.
- Weeks 11 through 13: Chapters 11,14,17. Exam four on those chapters.
- FINAL EXAM (Comprehensive): WEDNESDAY DECEMBER 6, 2017; 12:30-2:30pm, SAME ROOM.

MISSED CLASS: Make arrangements with a classmate to get notes that you missed. You don't have to notify me if you are unable to attend class.

EXAMS: *I do not assign specific dates to the chapters or exams. The "weeks" are approximations. When exam time approaches, we will discuss an exam date in class that serves the majority. Exam dates will allow plenty of time between completing the material that will be tested and the exam itself. I do not offer make-up exams, take the test on the decided date. If an exam is missed, your final exam will count double. Don't miss the final.*

Exams are listed on this syllabus and will cover material indicated. Exams contain multiple choice questions. The final exam is selectively comprehensive. Bring a UNO SCANTRON (Blue OR Green) form (available at the bookstore) and a pencil to record your answers on each exam. I will have each exam graded and will post the scores to a spreadsheet and send it to the class, listed by the last four digits of your student number.

Be self-sufficient, most in this course are business majors, I will treat you like a college student that wants to graduate in business. I do not offer secretarial services; emails that ask what was covered in class (because of an absence), what date is a test to be held, what is on the tests, etc., If you regularly attend class, you will know when exams will be given.

I will have the exams with me for display before class in class periods after the exam date and up until the next exam for anyone that wants to view their answers. I do not spend class time "going over" exams.
