Dear Friends of O.C.I.M.A.,

As we enter 2017 we want to bring you up to date on the progress that Fr Nick's dream has made in this past year. Although we continue to help the poorest in Ecuador, our primary focus and biggest strides have been in Guatemala.

At the school in Santa Rosa, where OCIMA sponsors about 30 young women, Sister Silvia was proud to say that the academically outstanding alumni include dentists, lawyers, engineers, teachers, professors and many who have joined various religious orders. Sister Silvia wrote: "The Lord watches over our work and puts us on the path to helping and generous people, like you, who believe in education. May the Lord reward you with a life full of blessings..." Father Nick's work lives on through your generosity and people like Sister Silvia.

In Santa Elena Sister Marcella continues with her tireless work coordinating the activities of the Orphanage, Day Care Center, Nutritional Center and Clinic. Currently there are 30 girls living at the Orphanage who range in ages from 7 to 18. All girls study in different schools in the area according to their age and ability. They live permanently at the



Orphanage until the Juvenile Courts find a suitable family that guarantees the safety of the girl. This year, four young ladies were assigned to families to assist them in integrating back into society.

St. Irenaeus Church continues to actively partner with O.C.I.M.A. by packing food for the people in the Morales region. Each packing costs O.C.I.M.A. \$27,000. In 2017, we would look to increase our support of Morales with the continued generosity and support of our Friends and Patrons.



That brings us to the largest change that has occurred in the last two years. With O.C.I.M.A.'s help, the Clinic has made tremendous strides toward adding a surgical facility. Every week, the clinic serves 450-500 people. And now, there is a team of surgeons and anesthesiologists who do surgical procedures and operations.

Sister Marcella wrote: "We aspire to be

the best health care facility in this region, providing a service of quality and love to the people. We strive to create an environment of goodness, respect and simplicity. We incorporate technological advances to improve services for all."



O.C.I.M.A.'s goal in 2017 is to provide Sister Marcella and her staff the equipment that is needed to
