Jesus is:

- Our over the power of sin-habits.

**Matt 7:7-11 (NLT)** <sup>7</sup> "Keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and the door will be opened to you. <sup>8</sup> For everyone who asks, receives. Everyone who seeks, finds. And to everyone who knocks, the door will be opened.

Ask, Seek, Knock all imply:

- risk-taking
- vulnerability
- persistence

Submission symbolizes an end to *pride*, to *self-sufficiency*, and to *self-directed living*.

Matthew 10:39 If you cling to your life, you will lose it; but if you give it up for me, you will find it."

Human \_\_\_\_\_\_ is easily the single largest obstacle to accepting the gifts which the Heavenly Father desires to give us.

<sup>9</sup> "You parents—if your children ask for a loaf of bread, do you give them a stone instead? <sup>10</sup> Or if they ask for a fish, do you give them a snake? Of course not! <sup>11</sup> So if you sinful people know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give good gifts to those who ask him.

"sinful" = someone that is not living a God-centered life; simply a secular life.

"And because Joseph was a descendant of King David, he had to go to Bethlehem in Judea, David's ancient home. He traveled there from the village of Nazareth in Galilee. 5 He took with him Mary, his fiancé, who was obviously pregnant by this time. 6 And while they were there, the time came for her baby to be born. 7 She gave birth to her first child, a son. She wrapped him snugly in strips of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the village inn."

Do you look at this baby in a manger and see just a \_\_\_\_\_\_ or do you see the ?
