If the application passes this review, I agree to a home and yard visit on a mutually agreed date by a Charlotte Cocker Rescue representative before an adoption decision is made.

Furthermore, I understand and accept that the adoption decision depends upon many factors, including -- but not limited to -- the compatibility of the family and home to the individual dog and other applications received on the dog. I understand and accept that it is the Charlotte Cocker Rescue prerogative to decide which home is most appropriate for the individual dog, and therefore I will not take issue with the decision. Unless otherwise indicated by the Charlotte Cocker Rescue, I may be considered for another dog.
