MISSI LASTRA IN MIAMI FOR MARCO RUBIO'S ANNOUNCEMENT

Missi Lastra had a once in a lifetime experience...the chance to be present when a politician announced he is running for president. Below are her thoughts and impressions of that event. *THIS IS NOT AN ENDORSEMENT.*

I was in Tallahassee for FFRW's annual Tally Days when I got a news bulletin on facebook that Marco Rubio was making an important announcement at the Miami Freedom Tower on April 13th. I quickly texted a friend to ask if she knew if he was running for President and I received an immediate response, "Yes, go to the website and get your ticket now!" How exciting, but not surprising.

The Freedom Tower is a historical and iconic building that is very meaningful, especially to the vibrant Cuban community in Miami-Dade County. He, or his team, made the perfect venue choice for his announcement. It was HOT, so HOT, with way too many people crammed into the main auditorium like sardines, but the music was thumping with Miami natives Pit Bull and Gloria Estefan - the energy was intense. I remember thinking it was good he was doing this in Miami because the energy of this city is like nowhere else - and it proved to be true on April 13th!

The evening commenced with a prayer from Pastor Greg Laurie, who scolded the excited crowd at one point, "You are not supposed to clap and cheer during prayer!" We settled down after that much needed rebuke, but got fired up all over again when Rubio came out. Marco Rubio is a true orator and gave an excellent speech, addressing most of the issues facing our nation; global leadership, Iran, education, immigration, Obamacare, family not government, taxes, veterans and a few I didn't jot down. Again, there were no surprises as his stand on the issues have been consistent, though he sounded even more confident, more passionate and more determined than ever.

I was particularly moved when he said "We need to make a generational choice about what the future of our country will be!" He made reference to the USA being an "Exceptional" country which was straight from his 2010 Senate Campaign centered around "Exceptionalism." He announced his campaign theme, "A New American Century." Marco poked a little fun of Hillary's Presidential campaign ad that aired the previous day, without specifically naming her he stated that she was a leader of yesterday.

"Yesterday is over. And we are never going back," Rubio said, as the crowd cheered. "Before us now is the opportunity to author the greatest chapter yet in the amazing story of America. We can't do that by going back to the leaders and ideas of the past."

Marco looks like he has not aged at all over the last few years. His wife Jeanette was stunning and vibrant as always. Their children have grown so much and were perfect angels on the stage. They represented an American family, one from Cuban immigrants who came from hard work ethics, fairness and patriotism - but neither wealth nor privilege. They could be any American family and ideally, could connect with most. The difference is, daddy/hubby is running for President of the United States of America.

I took away from Rubio's announcement a fervent desire to get America back on track. He spoke of this exceptional country and all we have achieved. He also spoke of a new century that can restore America and launch us to a better place. Rubio spoke of the son of a bartender and a maid (himself of course) and the American dream. April 13th was an exciting and moving experience that I will not soon forget. I will leave you with one of Marco Rubio's quotes:

"A collection of immigrants and exiles, of former slaves and refugees, together built the free-est and most prosperous nation ever." - Marco Rubio


