BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The new year is now in full swing for the Board. Projects for the coming year are being discussed, and priorities established. I hope all of the residents come to the monthly meeting to hear what we are planning.

I am very sorry to announce that Larry Lillie has resigned from the Board as of January 10th. This is a real loss to all of us. He has faithfully served for 14 years. Larry was definitely the go-to guy. He was always there to assist any member of the Board. Although I personally am sad to see him go, I understand his need to enjoy some of his retirement years. Thanks, Larry, for a job well done.

The gate and fence at the pool was repaired. A lock was installed on the gate. The code for the lock is the same as the Clubhouse door. If you do not remember the code, please call a Board member and we will give it to you.

The Office has received many calls about the new maintenance fees. They were published in the annual meeting documents and again in the Forum. The new fees for A homes is \$299.18, and B homes \$338.08. If you have a question about which one your home is, please call the Management Office at 727-573-5670.

I have had some questions about insurance for our homes. Each resident must have a homeowner's policy, not condominium insurance. Neither the Masters nor

the Unit carries insurance for any of the homes. Although we maintain the outside of the home we DO NOT insure them. Please check with your agent to be sure you have adequate coverage. If you have questions about your insurance coverage, please contact your agent.

Residents are still asking about replacement of the lawns. As I previously discussed, the lawns will be evaluated in the spring, and we will address the worse lawns first, and proceed to correct the remaining lawns as money allows. Spring begins March 20th. This will be an ongoing project. The recommendation from the extension office as well as the lawn company is to wait until there is no threat of temperatures below 50 degrees. St. Augustine grass will not grow in cold weather; it is like some of us who only thrive when it is warm.

We recently had a problem with feral cats and their kittens. We have captured several of them. Please do not feed wild animals, as this encourages them to stay in the area. If you see cats and/or kittens please, call the Office and we will attempt to capture them. A reminder: ground feeding of any animals is forbidden in Unit Five. This includes birds, squirrels, etc. The food is an attraction for rats.

The Mainlands now has a new website that will give financial information, annual audit reports, newsletter, unit calendar, clubhouse events, meeting agendas, unit documents, by-laws, rules and regulations, current maintenance fees, budget comparison, balance sheets, etc. TheMainlands.com is the

address. Please look at this site and let us know if you would like to see additional information.

It has again come to my attention that dog owners are not picking up after their dogs. No one wants to clean up after someone's dog. The rule is all dogs must be on a leash when outside the home. The owner must have equipment with them to clean up after the dog. If we identify the owner who is not following the rules they will be fined.

If you put your trash out the night before pick-up and it is in a plastic bag, you are responsible for picking up the trash left after it is ravaged. The blackbirds tear open the bags, and the trash is scattered on adjoining lawns and streets. Please be respectful of your neighbors, and clean up your trash.

The Master's Board passed some new resolutions at their January meeting. The first is if a resident has guests staying longer than seven days, they must register them with the Mainlands Office. Second, no overnight parking is permitted on the streets. Signs have been placed at all the entrances stating no overnight parking or the cars will be towed at the owner's expense. This rule will be enforced. If you have guests and need additional parking, permits are available for the Clubhouse parking lot, and can be obtained from the Office or by calling me. Lastly, no businesses can be run from homes. We recently discovered a house listed on AirBNB. The resident will be notified to discontinue this.

A reminder to all residents an Alteration Request is needed for any work outside of your home.
