

Electronically verify your identification documents against records held by the relevant Government departments



Take photographs of all identification documents and a head shot of you without glasses or coverings



Ask you to sign a declaration stating that the documents are original, true and correct



Witness your execution of other conveyancing documents such as the client authorisation and purchaser declaration



If all documents are in order this process should take 15 minutes per person

What documents you must provide at your appointment

Australian passport or Foreign passport

Plus: Australian driver's licence or NSW photo card

Plus: Proof of address (eg bank, utility, rates or insurance document)

OR

Australian passport or foreign passport or Australian driver's licence or NSW photo card

Plus: Australian birth certificate or Australian Citizenship certificate or descent certificate

Plus: Medicare card or Centrelink card or Dept. Veteran Affairs card

Plus: Proof of address (eg bank, utility, rates, tax, insurance or superannuation statement)



Marriage certificate (issued by BDM) or change of name certificate (if applicable)

Visa and English Translation if using Foreign passport



ALL DOCUMENTS MUST BE ORIGINALS

and
IN ENGLISH

or

ACCOMPANIED BY AN ENGLISH TRANSLATION.

If you can not provide a passport, driver's licence or photo ID card you must provide an identity declaration.

An identity declaration is a written document by a person who declares that they have known you for at least 12 months and that you are who you purport to be.

The Identity declarant is the person who makes the declaration that they have known you for 12 months. The identity declarant declares this in writing using a document known as a statutory declaration.

The identity declarant is a person who has known you for 12 months and

is 18 years or above

+ does not have a mental incapacity

+ is not bankrupt

+ is not your relative

+ is not involved in your matter

If you DO have a birth certificate

If you DO NOT have a birth certificate

must be a person who is an Australian legal practitioner, court officer, licensed conveyancer, bank manager, doctor, nurse, police officer, public servant or local Government officeholder

The identity declarant must sign the statutory declaration in the presence of a Justice of the peace, notary public, Commissioner of the Court or Australian legal practitioner

If an identity declaration is required, we must be notified.
