this year's annual High Desert Conservation Coalition Meeting. February 14th saw this event come together at the Sterling Inn in Victorville with several conser-



vation organizations setting up information tables. Examples of organizations in attendance were the

Citizens Climate Lobby, Defenders of Wildlife, Friends of Mojave Narrows Park, Sierra Club, and Transition Habitat Conservancy.

The event provided the organizations the opportunity to network with each other as well as the general public. Following a slide presentation, "The Little Known Gem of the High

Desert", given by the Friends of Juniper Flats about the Juniper Flats area and the work we do there, each attending organization gave a brief presentation about their organization.

Being the 16th annual Conservation Coalition meeting, these events provide the opportunity for conservation

organizations to work together for the benefit of all residents in the High Desert.



# WEMO and the Hiking Trail Designation Project

We understand from the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) that the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) guiding the West Mojave Route Network Project (WMRNP) will be coming out in late March. The WMRNP amends the 2006 WEMO plan.

As reported in last month's newsletter, Friends of Juniper Flats has held meetings with the BLM to establish officially designated hiking trails in Juniper Flats. We have requested BLM to include hiking trails in the WEMO plan, and have offered specific routes for their consideration.

# Land Stewardship

Land stewardship is an important concept and one embraced by the Friends of Juniper Flats. We are looking for small teams of volunteers to assist with habitat restoration, monitoring activities, and clean-up efforts. A particularly important area for such teamwork is the Arrastre Waterfall area near Powerline Rd. in Juniper

Flats. This beautiful riparian area is fairly easy to access, such as via the Arrastre Waterfall trailhead.

There are also many other areas that qualify as "Stewardship Areas" and include restoring disturbed areas using a variety of restoration techniques, trail work, monitoring and collecting data in restored areas, and general clean-up. We rely on volunteer teams to help us accomplish our mission of protecting, preserving and restoring Juniper Flats.
