Geneva Welding Expansion Adds Space, Jobs and Products

Steve Yates, owner of Geneva Welding since 1983, has done a major expansion at his business on 13th Street in Geneva. He recently completed a 11,200 Sq. Ft. building, purchased some new manufacturing equipment and has hired three new employees.

Yates said he plans to increase his retail supply area, expand his trailer business and is looking into some other types of products that will grow his business.

Currently he builds pivot bridges that he sells nation wide, builds utility trailers and does repair and custom welding.



Mr. Yates was able to take advantage of some low interest loans through the Geneva LB840 funds for economic development and the Southeast Nebraska Development District (SEND) revolving loan fund. He started planning his expansion several years ago and met with the FCDC staff, a NE Department of Economic Development Consultant and a business loan officer from SEND. He is excited to use the new building and equipment and provide quality products and service for his customers.

TOURISM AT WORK FOR NEBRASKA

Did you know that. . .

- ◆ Travelers spent over \$3.7 billion in Nebraska during 2008.
- ◆ State tax revenues from tourist totaled \$131.4 million.
- ◆ Tourism-related industries employ 40,000 Nebraskans
- ◆ Tourism is Nebraska's third largest earner of revenue from outside the state.

Barn quilts are usually 8 x 8 pieces of wood painted with a quilt block design. The quilt block is then attached to barns or other large structures.

The Barn Quilt project goals are to promote agri-tourism and help preserve rural architecture and local culture by showcasing the legacy of quilts and their artistic patterns on barns and other structures. The plan is to have 16 quilts on barns throughout Fillmore County in the next 18-24 months.

He also carries a variety of supplies for plumbing, sprayers, and builds hydraulic hoses. Batteries, filters, oil and some repair parts are also available.

They say nothing ever stays the same and that is certainly true in Fillmore County. That really came to mind as I was working on a report about the economic growth during the last three years. I needed to determine the number of new businesses, business expansions., business closings, and how many businesses transitioned to new owners. Working with the city and village clerks I attempted to come up with the numbers.

- New businesses 17 (Two manufacturers)
- Business expansions 8
- Business transitions 6
- Business closings 5

The research showed that while 65 jobs were lost 105 jobs were created or retained.

There is other progress in the county as well. Housing rehabilitation programs are at work in Fairmont and Geneva. Plans for revitalizing downtown Geneva have been drawn-up and the Fillmore County hospital has done a facility feasibility study and is looking towards the future. Entrepreneurs continue to stop in the office to ask questions and find resources.

As the FCDC works to diversity our local economy, broaden the tax base and provide employment opportunities, citizen input and participation is important.
