
Optional Activities

July 23-29, 2017 • Santa Fe, New Mexico

Santa Fe is a city rich in Native American tradition and big-city modernity. Each year, visitors from around the globe flock here to enjoy the city's many historical and cultural offerings. To ensure you have an opportunity to enjoy some of Santa Fe's many attractions, special tours and excursions have been arranged specifically for our participants.

Sunday, July 23

Fly-Fishing



Discover the thrill of casting to rising trout in the beautiful Pecos River. Your professional guide will lead you to a pristine site for your fishing adventure, and will take the mystery out of the art of fly-fishing. Both the novice and the advanced angler will enjoy the beauty and peacefulness that surrounds them in northern New Mexico.

COST: \$265 per person includes transportation, a river guide, boxed lunch, all necessary fly-fishing gear and equipment, gratuities and NM Tax. (NM Fishing license is additional).

7:00am-2:00pm

Bandelier National Monument

Travel to Bandelier National Monument where you'll descend into a canyon filled with the ruins of the Anasazi Indians, colloquially "the Ancient Ones." Located on the Pajarito Plateau of the volcanic Jemez Mountains, Bandelier was the home of the Anasazi from the eleventh to fourteenth centuries. Excavated over 90 years ago, these ruins were once home to over 200 people, ancestors of today's Pueblo Indians. Hundreds of petroglyphs carved by the original residents are still visible. You may walk along easy paths past the remains of ancient Pueblo dwellings to the cliff dwellings where you can climb ladders to peer inside.

COST: \$65 per person includes private transportation, professional guide, bottled water, entrance fees, gratuities and NM State Tax.

Tent Rocks



Join us for a beautiful slot canyon hike through the unique geological area known as Kasha-Katuwe Tent Rocks. Tent Rocks is an area that features large, cone-shaped rocks hugging the steep cliffs of Peralta Canyon. These formations were originally created by the powerful dual forces of vulcanism and erosion - which have built up, reshaped and then torn down this landscape over time. While uniform in shape, the tent rock formations vary in height from just a few feet to over 90. Most of the trail is on a gradual sloping incline through a slot canyon that is an invigorating but not strenuous walk. A steep climb to the top of the mesa is available at the end of the trail for those interested in a challenge and a spectacular view. Please bring layered clothing, a sun blocking hat, good walking shoes and sunscreen.

COST: \$65 per person includes transportation, professional guide and entrance fees, bottled water, gratuities and NM State tax.

8:30am – 12:30pm

Walking Tour of the Historic Santa Fe Plaza



Walk through more than 400 years of history, art, and culture. Learn about the historic Plaza and the Palace of the Governors (whose occupants have included government and military leaders from Spain, Mexico, the Confederacy, the U.S. and Indian nations). Learn about St. Francis Cathedral, and explore the Loretto Chapel and its miraculous staircase; the oldest church; the capitol, and other major Santa Fe historical sites.

COST: \$16 per person includes professional guide, entrance to Loretto Chapel, gratuities and NM State Tax.

Monday, July 24

Abiquiu Landscape Tour with Lunch

8:00am – 2:00pm



Travel north through the Rio Grande Valley into the Chama River Valley area, northwest of Santa Fe, to view the spectacular Chinle red rock formations, which were the frequent subject of paintings by Georgia O'Keeffe. On this trip we'll take a special behind the scenes tour at the Ghost Ranch, O'Keeffe's summer home for many years, where our local guide will take us to sites where O'Keeffe painted at the Ranch and share stories of her time in this colorful landscape.

COST: \$150 per person includes transportation, professional guide, landscape tour, lunch (entrée, dessert and non-alcoholic beverages) and gratuities and NM State Tax.

Walking Tour of the Historic Santa Fe Plaza

9:00am – 11:00am



Walk through more than 400 years of history, art, and culture. Learn about the historic Plaza and the Palace of the Governors (whose occupants have included government and military leaders from Spain, Mexico, the Confederacy, the U.S. and Indian nations). Learn about St. Francis Cathedral, and explore the Loretto Chapel and its miraculous staircase; the oldest church; the capitol, and other major Santa Fe historical sites.

COST: \$16 per person includes professional guide, entrance to Loretto Chapel, gratuities and NM State Tax.

Traditional New Mexican Cooking Class

9:30am – 1:00pm

Warm, spicy tastes and enticing aromas evoke Santa Fe's rich cultural traditions. This class on the traditional foods of New Mexico is at the heart of the Santa Fe School of Cooking and allows you to experience this delicious cuisine, including local cooking techniques and the lore of the region. Today's class includes flour tortillas, carne adovada (red chile marinated pork), chiles Rellenos, calabacitas (green chile, squash, corn), refritos, and sopaipillas. This is a demonstration style class including recipes and lunch.

COST: \$95 per person includes escort to school (10-minute walk), professional instruction, recipes, lunch, gratuities and NM State Tax. Alcoholic beverages are on an individual basis.

Tuesday, July 25

Tsankawi Ruins Tour

8:00am – 12:00pm



Tsankawi is part of Bandelier National Monument, but is undeveloped and unexcavated. The trail follows centuries-old paths through the area where the ancestral Pueblo people lived. Imagine the people tending their gardens and going about their daily lives surrounded by the expansive vistas of what are now known as the Jemez Mountains, the Sangre de Cristo Mountains, and valleys resulting from the Rio Grande rift. The 1.5-mile trail through Tsankawi takes you along centuries-old paths of the ancestral Pueblo people. In many areas, the trails have been worn into the rock 8 to 24 inches or more as the people traveled from the mesa tops to their farms in the canyons below.

COST: \$65 per person includes transportation, professional guide, monument entrance fees, bottled water on board, gratuities and NM State Tax.

Tent Rocks

8:30am – 12:30pm



Join us for a beautiful slot canyon hike through the unique geological area known as Kasha-Katuwe Tent Rocks. Tent Rocks is an area that features large, cone-shaped rocks hugging the steep cliffs of Peralta Canyon. Wednesday, July 26

Private Tour of the Archaeology of Ghost Ranch

8:00am – 2:00pm

A walking tour to archaeological sites on our 21,000 acre property: there are two- rock-shelter sites here at the Ranch; one dates back 8,000 years and the second 2,000 years. These sites have been the focus of excavation for seminar groups for several years. Dr. Florence Hawley Ellis spent many years at Ghost Ranch teaching, excavating and cataloging discoveries from the area. Our anthropology museum bears Dr. Ellis' name and includes artifacts from several different indigenous tribes who have lived and hunted in this area. Two miles of walking. Limited to 8 people.

COST: \$165 per person includes transportation, guide, bottled water, tour, gratuities and NM State Tax.

Chimayo Tour with Lunch

9:00am – 2:00pm

Enjoy a drive through the beautiful sandstone formations into the lush Chimayo Valley. The tour will take us north of Santa Fe along the "High Road", passing through several small 18th and 19th century Hispanic farming communities before finally arriving at the village of Chimayo, located in a beautiful valley in the foothills of the Sangre de Cristo Mountains. Stops include the charming Santuario de Chimayo, the most important Catholic pilgrimage site in the Southwest, and Centinela Weaving.

COST: \$95 per person includes transportation, professional guide, donations, lunch (entrée, dessert, non-alcoholic beverages), all service, gratuities, and NM State Tax.




Contemporary Southwest Cooking Class

9:30am – 1:00pm

Santa Fe's unique cuisine melds the region's rich cultural traditions with new ideas to create a contemporary style of Southwestern fare. Bandelier National Monument

1:00pm – 5:00pm

Travel to Bandelier National Monument where you'll descend into a canyon filled with the ruins of the Anasazi Indians, colloquially "the Ancient Ones."
