Build your own rain barrel! Save money and help to protect our streams. A collaborative community workshop with the Saucon Creek Watershed Association and Lower Saucon Township's Environmental Advisory Council.

Rain barrels are a great water-saving device and ideal for gardens! The barrel sits underneath a downspout to collect water from the roof at each rain event; the water can be saved and used to water plants in your yard. This helps save groundwater resources, utilizes higher quality water for plants, decreases water and sewer bills and also reduces the amount of pollution that could be picked up from the rain water as it passes over driveways and roads before entering our local streams and rivers.

You will be guided through building your own! No tools necessary - all parts included. \$35.00 for the complete kit and build-it-workshop. Cash or checks made payable to WCLV.
