The Wisconsin Update in Geriatric Medicine and Board Review Course Program

September 24, 2019 - September 27, 2019

Course Description

The Wisconsin Update in Geriatric Medicine and Board Review Course is an in-depth, knowledge-based review of the field of Geriatric Medicine. It is designed for all providers who care for older adults: physicians, physician assistants, nurses, nurse practitioners, pharmacists, social workers and psychologists who wish to provide better care for their patients.

Physicians and other clinicians planning to sit for the American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM), the American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) Examination in Geriatric Medicine (or recertification) or comparable examinations for other health disciplines will also benefit from the course, which is jointly provided by the University of Wisconsin– Madison Interprofessional Continuing Education Partnership (ICEP) and the Medical College of Wisconsin.

During the course, participants learn about principles of aging; the clinical approach to the geriatric patient; major syndromes such as dementia, incontinence, falls and metabolic bone disease; organ-specific diseases that have special import for the geriatric patient; and clinical pearls regarding care for the geriatric population. Special emphasis will be placed on neuropsychiatry, pharmacological and non-pharmacological approaches to treatment, and systems of geriatric care including long-term care and geriatric assessment. The course offers didactic sessions, question and answer sessions with presenters, and case-based learning. In addition to the plenary sessions for all interprofessional learners, specialized breakout sessions will be offered for social workers and pharmacists.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to: Discuss the diagnosis and management of common geriatric syndromes (e.g., urinary incontinence, metabolic bone disease, dementia, and falls). Describe organ-specific changes and diseases as they relate to the geriatric patient. Develop a clinical approach to geriatric patients based on knowledge of geriatric syndromes. Summarize the principles of preventive medicine, ethics, rehabilitation, and psychiatry as they relate specifically to the geriatric patient. □ Discuss appropriate pharmacologic and non-pharmacologic treatments for older □ Identify pharmacokinetic/ pharmacodynamic changes that affect drug use in the geriatric patient. Discuss the social milieu in which the elderly patient lives. Recognize the complex service delivery network that has been devised to serve the elderly patient. Describe the operation of long-term care systems and specialized geriatric

assessment programs designed to treat the elderly person.
