Charles F. “Chuck” Swisher

I had the good fortune to have known Chuck for some 20+ years. He led the charge to save and restore San Francisco’s great Exposition Organ (Austin Opus 500) located in the San Francisco Civic Auditorium. Like so many other municipal pipe organs, the Exposition Organ was forgotten and went silent; but in 1984 Chuck founded “The Citizens’ Committee To Preserve The San Francisco Municipal Pipe Organ” and shined a spotlight on this important piece of San Francisco history.

Through out the mid-late 1980s Chuck rallied to get the instrument back up and playing. He organized volunteer organ builders and organists, conducted “organ crawls” and recording sessions and helped raise funds.

In 1988, the instrument was showcased at the 33rd Annual National Convention of the Organ Historical Society. Things looked promising, but in 1989 the Loma-Prieta earthquake caused great damage to the instrument. Since then, the organ has never played another note.

Chuck loved this pipe organ and were it not for his dedication, “The Exposition Organ” would surely have been forgotten and lost. Chuck’s spirit will always be connected with Austin Opus 500.

In early 2002, I got to spend some time with Chuck and interviewed him to capture some of his important recollections and stories about the instrument.† He was an expert in audio, lighting and pipe organs and a creative and smart audio consultant and engineer. He also co-produced some of Virgil Fox’s legendary multimedia light shows at Winterland and Amazing Grace, both in San Francisco.

Chuck was also involved with the Midmer-Losh Boardwalk Hall organ in Atlantic City, New Jersey. He, along with the late John “Jack” Clotworthy would eventually become executive producers for my documentary film “The Senator’s Masterpiece”. Their belief and trust in me opened many doors and allowed me access to tell the story of the world’s largest pipe organ.



I spoke with Chuck only a couple of weeks ago. I am sad to hear about his passing. We often take for granted that people will be around forever, and then one day, they are gone...

Rest in peace Chuck.

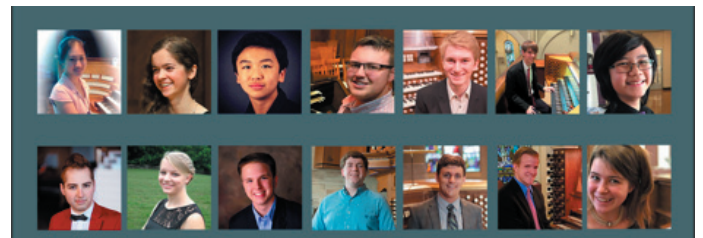

Steve's Corner of Organ Lit

The organ music of Denis Bédard is gaining popularity. This Canadian composer now has up to 52 opus numbers including variations on Amazing Grace, Christus Vincit, Lasst uns erfruen, Ein' fest Berg, Veni Creator, and Victimae Paschali Laudes. For starters, I recommend his Suite in the classical French organ style as an introduction to his accessible writing. The entire organ book is quite accessible and the Récit from this organ book is often heard in recitals. The three following books are progressively more difficult.

Suite du premier ton pour orgue (1993)

1. Plein Jeu, 2. Dialogue, 3. Récit, 4. Grand Jeu
