



November is Picture Book Month!



The time you spend with your child reading and writing can boost your child's intelligence. November is great time to begin reading to your children and talking about the stories you read together. As children begin to read on their own, let them read to you, and together discover the rich and wonderful world of picture books!

The Bienville Parish Libraries have a children's section with a wide variety of picture books. Your neighborhood librarian is a terrific resource for finding books you and your children will like to read together. From perennial favorites like, Curious George, and the Cat in the Hat to new favorites like, Pete the Cat, and Fancy Nancy.

Get Your Own Library Card!

Your child can get their own free library card when they turn six years old. Parents will need to present two forms of identification, (a valid ID, driver's license, electric bill, or water bill with home address), and have no late fees. Within a few minutes, your child will have their own library card! They can then choose their own books to take home and read.

5 Facts About Reading to Your Child

1. It will make your child smarter. When you read to your child regularly, they will enjoy stories and enjoy reading. Your child will also begin to understand empathy, as stories let you understand the world through someone else's experience.

2. It will help your child develop a better mastery of

language and speech skills. When you read books to your child, you expose them to speech skills early which is an excellent pre-literacy activity. By the time your child is entering preschool, they will most likely start sounding out words without any help.

3. You will develop a close relationship with your child.

The strongest parent-children relationships start early. Snuggling with your child to read a book will create a longlasting bond and beautiful memories that are hard to forget in a lifetime.

4. It will enrich family ties. Reading together as a family is great family time. It's fun and a perfect time for sharing passions, values, and perspectives. Your children have an excellent opportunity to communicate with you and each other around a book.

5. Reading to your child sends an important message:

Reading is fun! When your child views reading as a comforting and close activity with a parent, they are bound to love reading. When all the "hubbub" of life is stopped, and we spend one-on-one time with a child reading, children feel how special they are, and they relate those wonderful feelings with books.
