

PROVIDING GENDER AFFIRMING CARE: WORKING WITH TRANSGENDER AND GENDER NONCONFORMING CLIENTS

The central aims of this workshop are to:

- Identify gender bias and socialization as it may affect client/therapist and therapist/supervisor relationships.
- Identify and differentiate the use of terms that can be used to describe gender identities across a wide spectrum.
- Conduct a basic assessment of concerns related to gender identity and/or sexual orientation and co-occurrence with other mental health concerns.
- 4. Describe at least two common relational (transferential or countertransferential) dynamics that may occur in assessment or psychotherapy with trans and nonbinary clients.
