From Pastor Jeff Proya's Desk

Dear Jonathan,

It came to me early in the morning just before dawn, in a dream perhaps or not as I was awakened by the pain of a pinched nerve and a hard rain, of that I am certain. While reflecting on the language of John "death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more," which I had just recited over the ashes of another victim of the fall. Young man we are all in the same proverbial boat, when it comes to the reality of life given our limited understanding and our penchant for holding on to the known. I was thinking about a cousin Bobby who had just moved on and was named after my own pap Robert McCormick, a friend who had received notice if you will, and quite frankly myself given the pain of my own worn out vessel these days. The pictures his daughter had submitted in his memory, which began with his marriage to her mom, though numerous just a partial portrait of his life. A handsome young couple, I thought, with a spark of something that was present even then despite the distraction of the tux and gown of that captured moment. In truth I hadn't seen him for close to forty years I think, and while I

had heard of his diagnosis the images well of that handsome young man full of hopes and dreams there in the back of the car, had given way to another posing as one I had once known. It is I thought not easy to see one self or others one has loved showing the cost of life's journey or the scars of the struggle that must have been. Despite the obvious towards the end, there was ever present a glimpse of the young man I had encountered in my youth and in his. Moving on all part of the human experience, some of which is a mystery, while most of which is obvious to most of us who have journeyed down the road a bit, all the while yielding to a force beyond us. What if, it came to me our souls or what we call our souls have been since the beginning of time however that is measured or recorded or neither simply exist until in a moment of surrender or refusal we move on. We come into the world as we know it or soon discover it to be with an innocence that is birthed in, well human reality, however with no memory of or knowledge of ever having moved on only to discover later this transition is a painful pro-

cess. Our vulnerability gives way to experience which affects the innocence of trust thus doubt causes fear, fear of the unknown or change well moving on becomes while natural less desirable for most of us though there are exceptions young man always exceptions. The pain in my arm has subsided without notice, in a few hours part of my family will gather there in a small town in Georgia where I have never journeyed and reflect on a life that once had been and still is though a soul has moved on. I hope those gathered remember a little boy who ran through soft spring time meadows, played in clear waters of slow moving creeks albeit with hopes and dreams of moving on. They will harvest some of what has been, with hopes and dreams of their own, even as they come to grips with the reality of what is for such is life. We are you see all given notice, in one way or another, I think I will go back to bed, plead the case of my friend perhaps even my own then allow myself the opportunity to dream. Perhaps moving on isn't that bad after all!

Happy Labor Day

This is my 3rd letter on prayer. I hope we all can benefit from what it says and reveals. Prayer is our way to directly talk to God!

- Don't say anything at all:
- Sometimes the best thing to say is nothing at all. As you know, conversations are a two-way street so it's really important that we include time of silence in our prayer life. Sometimes we drive ourselves crazy saying, "I never hear God! He never answers my prayers." Well, have you ever thought maybe you don't hear Him because you never listen? Scripture compares God's voice to a quiet whisper that we must be still in order to hear (1 Kings 19:11-14). If our lives are constantly filled with noise we'll never hear that "quiet whisper" when it's trying to speak to us. I really encourage you to add a few minutes of silence every time you pray to listen for God and give Him time to talk to you. If you would like to add some silent time to your prayer life here is what I would suggest:
- Find a good place to pray where you're not easily distracted, maybe a quiet chapel or set up a prayer space in your room.
- Turn off your phone. Nothing can take our attention off God quicker than a ding from a cell. Literally just sit in silence. I know this is going to be really hard. Silence is going to be uncomfortable but just learning how to push through it and focus our attention on our own thoughts and what God might be bringing to our attention is a huge step in learning how to talk to God. I hope that these tips help you in your pursuit of God. Learning how to talk to God and listen to His voice is not always easy but it's definitely worth it.
