Happy Father's Day

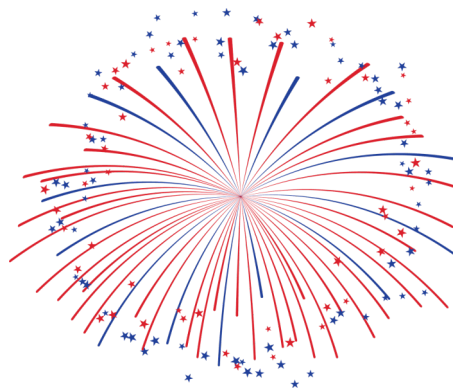
