

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***** INSTRUCTION SHEET FOR BIBLE LESSONS *****

- A. The Bible verses used in this study are taken from the King James Version of the Bible, translated out of the original tongues with the former translation diligently compared and revised.
- B. Before doing each lesson, take time to ask God to open your understanding and show you the truth.
- C. For the best results, <u>do only one lesson each day</u>. Meditate on each day's lesson. (There are four weeks of lessons per book)
- D. Keep in mind that these lessons are based on what the Bible says and not on man's opinion.
- E. These lessons are designed to help you to know the truth, to know the Lord in a personal way, and to trust what the Bible says and teaches you.
- F. Remember, it is not what you, I, or any preacher says, but what the Bible says.
- G. You must learn to stand on what the Bible says to "study to show yourself approved unto God, workman that needed not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (II Timothy 2:15).
- H. Who wrote the Bible? (II Peter 1:21)
- I. All Scripture is inspired by God (II Timothy 3:16).
- J. Regardless of what man says, the believer (Christian) <u>has direct access to the throne of God</u> and is responsible directly to God. This access is through Jesus Christ and Him only (I Timothy 2:5).
- K. These studies are to help you have peace of mind (Isaiah 26:3-4).
- L. These studies will help you know if you are going to Heaven or Hell (Romans 10:13).
- M. These lessons will help you with assurance and security; these are not the same. The securing of the believer is God's work; It is a part of God's great work of Salvation depending solely upon His infinite grace. Assurance is the believer's acceptance of the security provided for him in Christ; It is the result of the human soul resting in what God has promised in His Word to accomplish. This is why it is important to know what the Bible says (I John 5:11-13).

*** This lesson is taken from Colossians 1:1-6 ***

This week's verse to memorize: I Peter 4:2 That he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh to the lusts of men, but to the will of God.

THE BOOK OF COLOSSIANS

God commands us to oppose false teachings with the true Christian message. The heart of his reply is that Jesus Christ is able to give full salvation, and that these other beliefs and practices actually lead away from Him. Through Christ, God created the world, and through Him, He is bringing it back to Himself. Only through union with Christ is there hope of salvation for the world. God then spells out the implications of this great teaching for the lives of believers.

Note: In Colossians 1:1, we note that Paul is the person who wrote this book of the Bible by the Plus, he was an apostle of

This week's verse to memorize: I Peter 4:2 That he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh to the lusts of men, but to the will of God.

The Bible says, "For I would that you knew what great conflict I have for you and for them at Laodicea and as many as have not seen my face in the flesh." Who is the Bible talking about when it says, "many as have not seen my face in the flesh"?

"That their hearts might be comforted (encouraged), being knit together in love"; whose hearts is this verse talking about?

"And attaining to all riches of the full assurance of understanding to the acknowledgement (knowledge) of the mystery of God and of the Father and of Christ"; explain the meaning of this statement:

"In whom are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge." If wisdom and knowledge are hidden, how do we find them?

And this I say, "lest any man should beguile (deceive) you with enticing (persuasive) words." Why should we be beware of men deceiving us?

In verse 5, the Bible tells us that we should be steadfast in our faith in Christ; explain what this means:

*** This lesson is taken from Colossians 2:9-19 ***

<u>This week's verse to memorize: I Peter 4:2</u> That he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh to the lusts of men, but to the will of God.

For in Him dwelleth all the fullness of the Godhead bodily. Who is "Him" in verse 9?

Once again, the Bible is telling us in verses 7-9 that we must be sure of what is truth, and we must know that truth comes from the Bible, not what man says. ALWAYS go to the Bible to know the truth.

You are complete in Him (Christ), who is the head of all principality and power. Explain what it means to be complete in Him:

Buried with Him (Jesus) in baptism, wherein also you are what with Him?

How are you risen with Him?

These verses tell us of the power that God has, and that we as Christians will rise someday to be with the Lord forever.

And being dead in our sins, He quickened us (made us alive) together with Him; how?

Jesus took man-made laws and covered them with His blood on the what?

These verses tell us the reason that Jesus came down on this earth. He knew that we could not live up to man-made laws, which are not the will of God. Today, in some churches, men are still making laws that say you have to kneel and cross your heart and pray to Mary, wear a specific kind of clothes, and some men tell us to kneel on a rug toward the North. Nowhere does the Bible tell us to do any of these things, so they are man-made laws not God's laws. Remember, the Bible is the Word of God.

Jesus, having spoiled (disarmed) principalities and powers, did what to them?

Verses 16-19 explain that we are to beware of anyone who claims to be superior because of special visions, and who practices false humility and insists on false worship. Such people are all puffed up by their human way of thinking; verse 19 tells us they have stopped holding onto Christ.

Today's Bible reading is Psalm chapter 35.

This week's verse to memorize: Psalm 19:14

Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength, and my redeemer.

Wherefore if you be dead with Christ from the rudiments (basic principles) of the world, why are you then living where?

Verses 20-21 can be explained like this: You have died with Christ and are set free from the ruling spirits of the universe. Why then do you live as through you belong to this world? Why do you obey such rules as "Don't handle this," "Don't taste that," "Don't associate yourselves with others?" You, as a Christian, are a child of God and not of the world.

Explain in your own words what you think God is telling us to do in verses 20-21:

Which all are to perish with the using after the commandments and doctrines of whom?

Which things have indeed a shew of wisdom in will worship, and humility, and neglecting of the body; not in any honour to the satisfying of what?

*** This lesson is taken from Colossians 3:5-11 ***

This week's verse to memorize: Psalm 19:14

Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength, and my redeemer.

Tell us how you would plan to put to death faults such as fornication, uncleanness, inordinate affection (passion), evil concupiscence (desire), and covetousness, which is idolatry.

If you do not put to death your members (faults), explain what will happen according to verse 6:

You can read verse 7 like this: At one time, you used to live according to desires, and your life was dominated by them. Now, if you are saved, you have, or should have, put them to death.

Now that you are a Christian, you should have put off what?

Seeing that you have put off the old man, what should you stop doing to each other?

Do you think when you become saved that the above things in verse 8 will stop?

Note the first part of verse 8: "But now (that you are saved) <u>you</u> also put off"; LOOK, it says <u>YOU</u>. God will not do it. <u>YOU</u> are the one that has to put them off. It will not be easy, but the Holy Spirit will help you. Memorizing Bible verses will help you as well.

You now must put on the new man. Explain what this new man should be like:

This week's verse to memorize: Psalm 19:14

Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength, and my redeemer.

Put on, therefore, as the elect (chosen) of God, what?

Note the first part of verse 12. Explain how we can put on these things:

"Forbearing (bearing with) one another, and forgiving one another"; if any man have a quarrel against any, what should he do and why?

Can you say, I forgive my enemies, family, friends, and loved ones who have hurt me? Please explain your answer:

Once again, verses 12 and 13 tells us to "put on or forbear;" this is our job, not God's. You must work at it; it will not come overnight. We can't sit back and think our lives will change when we ask Jesus to come into our lives. Our wants and desires should change when Jesus is in control of our lives, but we are the ones that have to put on, forgive, forbear, and put off; no one can do these things for us.

And above all things, we should put on what?

INTRODUCTION

Titus was a Gentile who converted to Christianity and became a fellow worker and an assistant to Paul in his missionary work. Paul's letter to Titus, inspired by the Holy Spirit, is addressed to him as a younger helper in Crete who had been left there to supervise the work of the church.

Paul's letter to Titus expresses three main concerns. First, Titus possessed the kind of character traits that leaders should have, especially in view of the poor traits that many Cretans possessed at the time. Next, Titus is instructed by the Holy Spirit how to teach the various groups in the church: the older men, the older women (who are, in turn, to teach the younger women) and the young men. Finally, the Holy Spirit gives Titus advice regarding Christian conduct, especially the need to be peaceful and friendly and the need to avoid hatred, argument, and division in the church.
