
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#### \*\*\*\*\* INSTRUCTION SHEET FOR BIBLE LESSONS \*\*\*\*\*

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- A. The Bible verses used in this study are taken from the King James Version of the Bible.
- B. Before doing each lesson, take time to ask God to open your understanding and show you the truth.
- C. For the best results, <u>do only one lesson each day</u>. Meditate on each day's lesson (there are four weeks of lessons per book).
- D. Keep in mind that these lessons are based on what the Bible says, and not on man's opinion.
- E. These lessons are designed to help you to know the truth, to know the Lord in a personal way, and to trust what the Bible says and teaches you.
- F. Remember, it is not what you, I, or any preacher says, but what the Bible says.
- G. You must learn to stand on what the Bible says to "study to show yourself approved unto God, workman that needed not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (II Timothy 2:15).
- H. Who wrote the Bible? (II Peter 1:21).
- I. All Scripture is inspired by God (II Timothy 3:16).
- J. Regardless of what man says, the believer (Christian) <u>has direct access to the throne of God</u> and is responsible directly to God. This access is through Jesus Christ and Him only (I Timothy 2:5).
- K. These studies are to help you have peace of mind (Isaiah 26:3-4).
- L. These studies will help you know if you are going to Heaven or Hell (Romans 10:13).
- M. These lessons will help you with assurance and security; these are not the same. The securing of the believer is God's work. It is a part of God's great work of salvation depending solely upon His infinite grace. Assurance is the believer's acceptance of the security provided for him in Christ. It is the result of the human soul resting in what God has promised in His Word to accomplish. This is why it is important to know what the Bible says (I John 5:11-13).

(Matthew 14:26-31) Until you discover what it means to have faith, you cannot begin to walk by faith; doubts and disbelief will take over your mind and life. #### This week's verse to memorize: John 1:12

But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name.

There are people who suffer the effects of discouragement for years; they don't know how to repair the damage caused by this devastating landmine, and they begin to doubt. How does this loss of confidence and optimism begin?
Why art thou cast down, O my soul? And why art thou
: for I shall yet praise him for the help of his countenance (Psalm 42:5).
Disappointment is your emotional response to a failed expectation. When you allow disappointment to fester by refusing to recognize and deal with the failure, you slip into discouragement. Disappointments are inevitable, but believers don't have to be in bondage to discouragement.
O my God,
therefore will I remember thee from the land of Jordan, and of the Hermonites, from the hill Mizar. Deep called unto deep at the noise of thy waterspouts: all thy waves and thy bill (Psalm 42:6-7).
You will periodically face events that make you feel weak. Discouragement, however, should be temporary. Just as you drive through a tunnel, you can enter moments of discouragement and then come out on the other side. I have experienced situations in which I was very discouraged for a season of time. On occasion, I have had to get on my knees during the night to cry out to God for encouragement. After asking Him for a change in attitude and help to lay down my burdens, I have been able to fall back to sleep.
Yet the Lord will command his lovingkindness in the daytime, and in the night,
, and my prayer unto
(Psalm 42:8).
In order to gain victory, you must first look within yourself. You need to admit your specific discouragement as well as the unresolved conflicts in your heart. Identifying the root cause of your disbelief and disheartened feeling allows you to work through them.

#### Most importantly, you must turn to God.

As long as you keep dwelling on your hurt, your suffering, your embarrassment, or your doubts and shattered dreams, you will wallow in despair. But the moment you lift your head and say, "Father," you take the first step toward breaking free from doubt, disbelief, and discouragement.

Wait on the Lord: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the Lord. Have you ever heard a testimony from someone who went through a horrible tragedy? You may pay close attention to these accounts because the person involved has witnessed firsthand God's faithfulness and power to restore a broken life. Of all the witnesses to God's grace in times of doubt, none is more compelling than the life of Paul in the Bible. But I \_\_\_\_\_\_, that now at the last your care of me hath flourished again; wherein ye were but ye lacked opportunity. Not that speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, \_\_\_\_\_ (Philippians 4:10-11). Paul was no stranger to hardship. Throughout his ministry, he was chased, beaten, stoned, arrested, shipwrecked, and accused of heresy by both Jewish leaders and the Roman government. I know both how to \_\_\_\_\_ and I know how to \_\_\_\_\_ where and in all things I am instructed both to be full and to suffer need. I can do all things through (Philippians 4:12-13). This was certainly a stark contrast to Paul's early life, in which he enjoyed the finest luxuries and opportunities that his Roman citizenship and Jewish education provided. With so many amazing ups and downs in his life, Paul earned the right to proclaim, "I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity." Because you seek to live by Biblical values, the world does not understand your motivation and will therefore often stand against vou. These things I have spoken unto you, . In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world (John 16:33). The Bible never instructs you to ignore situations that cause you heartache, doubt, fear, or worry. In fact, the Bible is quite honest about what you as a Christian can expect from a life devoted to Christ. Jesus even warned, "In this world you will have trouble." How then can you rejoice when you face troubles? It is through your hardship that Christ often makes Himself know in your life. If you lived a trouble-free life, what need would you have for a Savior? My brethren, when ye fall into divers temptations; knowing this, that the trying of your faith \_\_\_\_\_\_. But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be , wanting nothing (James 1:2-4).

"I can do all things through Christ, which strengtheneth me." Do you have this limitless power source in your life? Ask God to reveal His Son's strength and ability to you.
