How's the Wind Blowing? You Must Not Be Afraid – Discussion (Matthew 8:23-27, 14:22-33)

Discussion

1. Message Point: Why must you not be afraid? Because fear doesn't come from God.

1 John 4:7-8, 18 Dear friends, let us love one another, **for love comes from God**. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. ⁸ **Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love**. ¹⁸ **There is no fear in love**. But perfect love drives out fear, **because fear has to do with punishment.** The one who fears is not made perfect in love. NIV

Romans 8:15-16 The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, **so that you live in fear again;** rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship. **And by him we cry, "Abba, Father."** ¹⁶ The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit **that we are God's children**. NIV

Discussion Topic: What is one of your fears? What is something that comes from God you can replace that fear with? Please elaborate.

2. Message Point: When must you not be afraid? When Jesus is with you.

Matthew 8:23-25 **Then he got into the boat and his disciples followed him**. ²⁴ Suddenly a furious storm came up on the lake, so that the waves swept over the boat. **But Jesus was sleeping**. ²⁵ The disciples went and woke him, saying, "Lord, save us! We're going to drown!" NIV

Matthew 28:19-20 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. **And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.**" NIV

Psalm 23:1-4 The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing. ² He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, ³ he refreshes my soul. He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake. ⁴ Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. NIV

Discussion Topic: How often during a typical day do you consider that Jesus is with you? Please elaborate.

3. Message Point: When must you not be afraid? When you can exercise your own faith.

Matthew 8:26-27 He replied, "You of little faith, why are you so afraid?" Then he got up and rebuked the winds and the waves, and it was completely calm. ²⁷ The men were amazed and asked, "What kind of man is this? Even the winds and the waves obey him!" NIV

Topic to consider: Can you think of a recent time you intentionally exercised your faith? Please elaborate.

4. Message Point: When must you not be afraid? When you are doing exactly what Jesus said.

Matthew 14:22-33 Immediately Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowd. ²³ After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray. Later that night, he was there alone, ²⁴ and the boat was already a considerable distance from land, buffeted by the waves because the wind was against it. ²⁵ Shortly before dawn Jesus went out to them, walking on the lake. ²⁶ When the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified. "It's a ghost," they said, and cried out in fear. ²⁷ But Jesus immediately said to them: "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid." ²⁸ "Lord, if it's you," Peter replied, "tell me to come to you on the water." ²⁹ "Come," he said. Then Peter got down out of the boat, walked on the water and came toward Jesus. ³⁰ But when he saw the wind, he was afraid and, beginning to sink, cried out, "Lord, save me!" ³¹ Immediately Jesus reached out his hand and caught him. "You of little faith," he said, "why did you doubt?" ³² And when they climbed into the boat, the wind died down. ³³ Then those who were in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God." NIV

Topic to consider: Can you recall an instance when you were doing something God said to do, but you began to be fearful? If so, please elaborate about the fear you felt.

Own Your Own (Points for Further Reflection)

A. Message Point: Why must you not be afraid? Because Jesus told you not to be afraid.

John 14:1 Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me. NIV

John 14:1 Jesus said to his disciples, "**Don't be worried!** Have faith in God and have faith in me. CEV

John 14:1 Jesus said to his disciples, '**Do not be sad or afraid.** Believe in God, and also believe in me. EASY

Topic to consider: How can Jesus telling you not to be afraid inspire you to overcome fears? Please elaborate.

B. Message Point: Why must you not be afraid? Because Jesus told us to be courageous.

John 16:33 "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. **But take heart!** I have overcome the world." NIV

John 16:33 These things I have spoken to you, so that in Me you may have peace. In the world you have tribulation, **but take courage**; I have overcome the world." NASB

John 16:33 "I told you these things so that you can have peace in me. In this world you will have trouble, **but be brave!** I have defeated the world." NCV

Topic to consider: What are you most fearful of?

- C. **Message Point:** When must you not be afraid? When you have thoughts of <u>doubt</u> about God's <u>love</u> for you.

Mark 4:35-38 That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side." ³⁶ Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. ³⁷ A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. ³⁸ Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. **The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?"** NIV

Topic to consider: Can you recall an instance you felt like God didn't love you? If so, please elaborate.

D. **Message Point:** When must you not be afraid? When you see <u>God's power</u> is <u>greater</u> than you thought.

Mark 4:39-41 He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. ⁴⁰ He said to his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?" ⁴¹ They were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!" NIV

Topic to consider: Can you recall a moment in your life that God did something greater than you thought he would? If so, please elaborate.
