Post Summary

The CONSEED Project, School of Social Sciences and Philosophy, seeks to recruit a full time post-doctoral researcher to conduct applied research in the area of behavioural economics and energy efficiency. The CONSEED project is funded by the European Commission under Horizon 2020 topic EE-08-2016.

The CONSEED project is looking for a highly motivated post-doctoral researcher with a demonstrated ability to do innovative and rigorous work related to behavioural economics and applied economics in the energy area. The research to be carried out will involve the analysis of a discrete choice experiment and a large field experiment on consumer

interactions with energy efficiency labelling. It will entail interaction with academics, industry and project partners around Europe, in particular with project partners CICERO in Norway.

The CONSEED project is in the School of Social Sciences and Philosophy which is a large multi-disciplinary School, comprised of four Departments (Economics, Philosophy, Political Science and Sociology), currently housed in two locations.

Standard duties and Responsibilities of the Post

The principal duties of the candidate will be to:

- Engage in research of a quality commensurate with publication in leading international economics journals
- Present their research at international conferences and research workshops
- Play a full role in the intellectual life of the School of Social Sciences and Philosophy including working collaboratively with academic colleagues in areas of shared research interest, and taking part in department seminars and workshops;
- Co-operate in the administration of the CONSEED research project.
- Perform other duties that will arise from time to time and as directed by Project Manager and Principal Investigator of CONSEED.

Qualifications

- Candidates must hold a PhD in behavioural/applied economics with excellent econometric skills. Candidates will also ideally have research experience post PhD.

Knowledge & Experience (Essential & Desirable)

- Experience of high-quality research preferably including experience of field experiments and/or discrete choice experiments (experience should be proven by a record of high quality publications in respected journals).
- Have experience of working as part of a research team in a busy and challenging work environment, including flexibility and willingness to work outside normal office hours when required.
- Have a high level of initiative and self-motivation.

- Be enthusiastic, flexible and highly motivated individual with strong interpersonal and administrative skills.
- Have strong organisational skills, ability to prioritise tasks, meet deadlines and work to time constraints while maintaining high levels of accuracy coupled with attention to detail.
- Have excellent interpersonal, organisational and communication skills (oral and written).

Skills & Competencies

- Suitable applicants will have a strong motivation to work in academic research, good communication and project management skills. They should demonstrate a passion for the field of behavioural economics applied to the energy sector.

Trinity College Dublin, the University of Dublin

- Trinity is ranked 52nd in the world in the THE World University Ranking for international outlook.

Research Performance

- Of the 981 institutions included in the THE World University Rankings for 2017, Trinity is in the top 15% internationally for research performance.
- Trinity is ranked in the top 20% internationally by QS for citations.

In the QS World University Rankings:

- Trinity College Dublin featured in the world's elite (Top 200) institutions in 25 of the 28 subjects in which it was evaluated by the QS World University Rankings by Subject in 2015. Of these, Trinity ranked in the top 100 in the world in 14 subjects and in the top 50 in the world in 6 subjects: English Language and Literature; Nursing; Politics and International Studies; History; Biological Sciences; and Modern Languages.

The Selection Process in Trinity

The Selection Committee (Interview Panel) may include members of the Academic and Administrative community together with External Assessor(s) who are expert in the area. Applications will be acknowledged by email.

Given the degree of co-ordination and planning to have a Selection Committee available on the specified date, the University regrets that it may not be in a position to offer alternate selection dates. Where candidates are unavailable, reserves may be drawn from a shortlist. Outcomes of interviews are notified in writing to candidates and are issued no later than 5 working days following the selection day.

In some instances the Selection Committee may avail of telephone or video conferencing. The University's selection methods may consist of any or all of the following:

- Interviews, Presentations, Psychometric Testing, References, Situational Exercises.

It is the policy of the University to conduct pre-employment medical screening/full pre-employment medicals. Information supplied by candidates in their application (Cover Letter and CV) will be used to shortlist for interview. Applications from non-EEA citizens are welcomed.
