Four Star Square Mystery Quilt a free mystery quilt pattern


Part Four of Four Star Mystery Quilt

So Far? In **Part Three** you sorted all your squares and you are now going to begin sewing.

Part 4 of Four Star Square

You will now sew the squares you sorted into baggies in the **First** section of Part Three.

You will be sewing two of the 2.5" squares of Fabric A to each 4.5" square of Fabric B you sorted into each baggie. Your finished block will look like this:



The [Step-by-Step instructions for making this block can be found on this page](#). In order to make the images small I have sacrificed color and image quality, but you should find it easy to understand the steps. You will find this technique a fast one with no triangles to cut and no bias edges to sew!

1. Take the 4 baggies and make 16 of the above blocks using Fabric B (4.5 in. squares) and Fabric A (2.5 in. squares).

2. Now, using the same sewing techniques you will make similar blocks with the fabric squares from the **Third** sorting section of Part 3.

A. Find the baggie that you labeled "D Corners" from Part 3 sorting. Sew the one 2.5 in. square of A Fabric to the one 4.5 in. square of D fabric. Cut and press it as the steps show you for the one corner. You will not be sewing a 2nd corner to these 4 squares. Put them back in the "D Corners" baggie when done.

B. Take the remaining 32 4.5 in. squares of D Fabric and the 64 2.5 in. squares of A fabric you sorted with them in Part 3. You will now sew these in the same format as the above double-adjacent corner blocks. **Important note:** If you are using a striped fabric as I suggested it is important that **all the corner triangles are oriented in the same way to the stripes in the D Fabric. The stripes should point toward the point formed by the corners.** The orientation should look like the image just below. If you are not using striped fabric you can ignore this instruction.

Minutes of the January 31, 2017 Board Meeting
(approved February 28th, 2017)

The meeting was called to order by Helen Wilems, President at 1:30 pm at the Keegan's Woods Community Building.

Board Members in attendance: Helen Wilems, Cathy Price, Gwen Goldsberry, Pauline Manes, Kay Paul, Mark Towle, Judy Wolter, Debbie Garner, and Sherri Stringfield. A quorum was present.
 Committee Members in attendance: Sakeenah Mubashshir, Barb Wall, and Diane Hickey.

The Minutes of the January 3rd, 2017 meeting were approved as presented.

The Treasurer's Report for January 2017 was approved as presented.

Announcements

Kay Paul announced that two bags of fabric scraps were donated to her for the CPGQ for use in charity quilts.

Sherri Stringfield reported on the Shop Hop progress. She has been contacting bus services and will be booking a bus that holds 50. The current plan is to proceed to Spring, Texas where there are 3 shops close together and spend the morning and lunch time in that area. The bus will then proceed to The Painted Pony Shop for a couple of hours, and then return to the FUMC lot. The date for the Shop Hop is June 15th, 2017 in lieu of the June business meeting.

Helen Wilems noted that the next board meeting will be on February 28th since the evening meeting is on March 1st.

Board and Committee Reports

President-Elect – Mark Towle

No Report

VP Membership - Judy Wolter

There are currently 170 active members in the Guild. There still some issues in MyGrove, but they are being addressed. Judy Wolter reminded the board members that anyone is able to post articles, updates, and photos in MyGrove. She does not have to be contacted to do this. She noted that you must post yourself; things posted under another post will not send out an update to the members. There was a question about inappropriate postings. Judy Wolter noted that she reviews the postings and can remove anything that should not be there. The newest postings are presented first.

VP Programs – Lisa Patterson

Absent

Helen Wilems reported that the program for February 1st, 2017 will be Betty Rivers and she will need the display stand for her presentation.

Programs-elect - Gwen Goldsberry

Gwen Goldsberry has Dr. Maggie McGuire tentatively set for January 3rd, 2018 to present "Feed Sacks and Chicken Linen: Using What They Had". This will cost \$200 and she is local. A motion to accept this proposed speaker was made by Pauline Manes and seconded by Debbie Garner. The motion was passed by the Board.

Gwen Goldsberry has Jackie Hillman tentatively set for March 7th, 2018 to present “Crayons – Break out that Box!” and demonstrate her technique. The cost is \$325. A motion to accept this proposed speaker was made by Sherri Stringfield and seconded by Pauline Manes. The motion was passed by the Board.

Gwen Goldsberry has Mary Massey tentatively set for April 4th, 2018 to present “Pieces of the Past” an Antique Quilt Trunk show. The cost is \$350. A motion to accept this proposed speaker was made by Debbie Garner and seconded by Cathy Price. The motion was passed by the Board.

Gwen Goldsberry has Kathy McNeil tentatively set for May 17th, 2018 to do a program and workshop. The program is “Tips, Tricks, and Stories” and cost \$425. The workshop will be “Feathers are Flying” applique. The cost will be \$350 plus a \$12 pattern per attendee. Kathy is not local, but travel expenses may be shared by several local guilds. A motion to accept this proposed speaker was made by Sherri Stringfield and seconded by Pauline Manes. The motion was passed by the Board.

Gwen Goldsberry has Cynthia Regone tentatively set to present “Scrap Quilts- Too Much is Never Enough” on August 1st, 2018. This will cost \$400 and is a Trunk show for the evening class. A motion to accept this proposed speaker was made by Debbie Garner and seconded by Sherri Stringfield. The motion was passed by the Board.

Gwen Goldsberry is working also on a program and workshop for October 18th, 2018. This is tentatively set to be Joe Cunningham with the topic “Rock the Block” for both program and workshop. Cost for the program is \$400 and cost for the workshop is \$650. This artist is from California and Gwen is working with other guilds to see if travel costs can be shared. A motion to accept this proposed speaker was made by Sherri Stringfield and seconded by Pauline Manes. The motion was passed by the Board.

Sherri Stringfield questioned if anyone in the guild is officially evaluating the speakers and workshop presenters. Gwen indicated that she does have notes in her Program Chair planning notebook from previous Chairs that indicated how the speaker/presenter performed and was received by the Guild members present. There is not an “official” evaluation process at this time. Sherri Stringfield recommended that perhaps standardizing the evaluation process should be investigated. Helen Wilems recommended that this be discussed at a later meeting.

Gwen has the bulk of her 2017-2018 programs set and will bring a summary of the approved and scheduled events to the next board meeting.

Debbie Garner reported that as a speaker Minay Sirois was well received, but many felt the workshop needed improvement.

On February 16th, the workshop will be presented by Nova Montgomery with the technique of “Winging it in Three Dimensions”. The supply list is available and space is available for sign-up.

On March 16th, the workshop will be presented by Andrea Brokenshire on the technique of “Snippet Confetti Background”. There is still space available in this workshop also.

Sign-up sheets will be at the meetings for those interested.

Workshop Chair-elect - Kay Paul

As noted in Gwen Goldsberry’s report, several workshop speakers are tentatively scheduled.

Treasurer – Pauline Manes

The annual fee for the storage facility is due. The amount for this year is \$2718. A brief discussion was held on how to reduce the amount being stored, but no consensus was reached. This will be tabled until later in the year.

Secretary – Cathy Price

Cathy Price asked if pricing should be included for the proposed speakers since there were concerns regarding this issue. The Board indicated that pricing for all speakers and workshops should be included so that the Guild membership sees these costs. This is one of the primary uses for the funds raised at the biennial Quilt Show.

Editor/Advertising – Diane Aleman

Shop Hop 2017 – Sherri Stringfield

Sherri Stringfield noted again that scheduling of this is in progress. She will be doing a “save the date” posting in MyGrove for this event. Sherri Stringfield will be soliciting the Guild members for new and/or gently used notions for the door prizes.

Community Service – Sakeenah Mubashshir

Sakeenah Mubashshir reported that the Guild has no UPC codes for Hobbs batting currently. She did redeem those we had for additional batting. Members are encouraged to turn the empty bags with the UPC codes in to Sakeenah so the Guild can redeem these for additional batting.

Barb Wall and Diane Hickey are coordinating the 2017 Quilt ticket printing for this year’s sales.

The meeting was called to order by Helen Wilems @ 9:59 am.

The minutes of the February 16th, 2017 general business meeting were approved as posted in the newsletter. The Treasurer’s report for February 2017 was approved as presented in the newsletter.

Pauline Manes presented the issue of the annual dues rate increase. There were no questions from the members. A quorum was present with sixty six voting members present. Sandy Winston motioned that the annual CPQG dues be increased to \$35 per year beginning next fiscal year. Sandi Pedersen seconded the motion. The Guild members present approved the motion.

Debbie has preview samples from the May 18th workshop on Pieced Hexies by Mickey Dupre for everyone to look at. Cathy Price will have the paper templates available for 50 cents for a packet if those attending do not wish to buy a large packet.

Treasurer: Pauline Manes

No Report

Secretary: Cathy Price announced that she has a few of the tickets (for Diane Hickey) for the 2017 donation quilt “Starry, Starry Night” for sale

Newsletter Editor: Diane Aleman reminded everyone that inclusions for the April newsletter should be to her by March 24th.

2018 Quilt Show Committee: Barb Wall announced that she received many suggestions for a theme and logo for the 2018 Tenth Anniversary show but these will be accepted until the end of the month when the committee will pick the theme. Barb Also announced that nominations for the Member Artist to be recognized at the show will be accepted from Guild members. The nominee should be okay with being nominated and should be a senior, experienced, and active in the Guild. These will be accepted thru April and then voted on. Send any nominees to Barb Wall.

Representative at Large: Sherri Stringfield announced the March birthdays and door prize winners.

She also announced that the Shop Hop details for June 15th are finalized. The cost will be \$30 and signup can begin today.

Membership: Judy Wolter reported that we now have 176 members. The directory and Guild trifold are available at the membership desk. She also noted that if you did not receive the email from her earlier this week to let her know. All email notifications should be working.

Activities: Barb Young reported that part 3 of the Mystery Quilt has been published. Sewing begins next month. Seventy two of the Port-a-Cath pillows made by the membership were taken to St. Luke’s and U.T. M.D. Anderson hospitals for distributions. This is an ongoing project.

Beekeeper: Penny Hurst reported that a new Art Quilt Bee is starting. There will be a meeting at the Sugar Land Branch of the Library on Eldridge next Thursday March 23 from 12 – 3 pm on the subject of fabric painting. Also the calendar for all of the Bees will be on MyGrove and in the Newsletter.

Community Service: Sakeenah Mubashshir reported that at the halfway mark of this membership year, the CPQG has donated 114 quilts, 149 blankets, 442 other items (ditty bags, hats, dog beds, pillowcases), and 130 scarves to the supported charities. This is well on the way to the 250 quilt goal set for the year, but she still has additional items that need to be worked on in the activity room.

Helen Wilems reported that Gwen Goldsberry was absent, but items for the VA “baby shower” are being accepted.

Quilts of Valor: Barbara Baxter announced that the next Quilts of Valor Sew-In will be on March 25th in the FUMC Music Rooms A&B from 10 am – 3 pm.
