January Meeting 1/6/2020



During our January meeting, Tom Mortenson will speak on the Suffragist Movement. You will read much about this throughout the year, but 2020 marks the 100th Anniversary of the 19th Amendment, the Women's Right to Vote. I remember hearing my grandmother talk about this when I was a young girl. Her mother was a suffragette and worked tirelessly to ensure that her friends understood the value of fighting for

the right. To her, the right to vote signified a much bigger shift in women's rights. It signaled that women were able to voice their opinions publicly when prior, this was not socially acceptable. It provided confidence to women to stand up for issues that affected women and families.

Tom is a Temple Terrace native and expert on the Women's Rights movement. He has published many works on the subject and was invited to attend the dedication of the recently dedicated Turning Point National Suffrage Memorial in August. We look forward to his talk!
