The program included members of the local and state chapters as well as members of American Legion USS Tampa. We honored Marsha hard work by baking blue star cookies for the event. We Thank Marsha for her work and

Insurance Program (CHIP) for a tax deduction. This will increase access to Primary Care Physicians for those who cannot afford full care.

Florida state physicians, as a group, asked Rep. Webster to introduce this so that they could continue to provide service to patients whose insurance does not cover all aspects of care. The doctors want to be able to provide care to these patients, but cannot afford to do so. You might want to contact your area Representative (if District 14, Kathy Castor) and ask for her support. The bill has not been passed by the House yet.
