I had a nice day this past Sunday, buying plants for my herb garden at Gilbertie's in Westport. One funny thing was that I had to buy mint and replant the barrel I grow it in – normally indestructible, my plants were smothered to death by a chicken who has been trying to hatch the engraved “Mint” rock I keep in there. Stupid chicken ... but I don't judge her, I know too many people who are busy trying to hatch rocks these days.

So let me ask the question: Are you spending your time and efforts working toward manifesting a realistic goal or outcome ... or are you patiently trying to hatch a rock?

You know, I am not even going to delve into that further, except to add that the month of May – while excruciatingly long, about halfway through I saw people catapulted out and into new jobs, homes, relationships, spiritual paths and mindsets so fast it made my head spin. After the misery of the Cardinal Cross through April and early May, which felt like being squashed under some giant thumb (gosh, you Libras suffered terribly!) when that pressure lifted people were just grateful to get out from under it and rush into whatever light or new life they could find. But I'm pretty confident that's exactly what The Universe wanted to happen, too! My friend Kim compared it to popping a zit – and while I find that comparison revolting, it is accurate in that it was painful and frustrating and messy ... but once done, cleanup and healing could commence. And anyone who has ever tried to use makeup to disguise or cover up a pimple

knows that no matter how expertly applied – you always know it is there, hasn't gone away. These problems and issues are being brought front and center thanks to Saturn's transit through Scorpio - for more on this topic see the March newsletter <http://www.talismanct.com/images/NL%20-%20Mar%2014.pdf>. And in fact, so many of you ARE dealing, and dealing well. Just facing up to the reality of (say) a career which no longer interests or inspires you, leading to the question "what else can I do?" and then the decision - whether to move forward intelligently ... or sit patiently on a rock, hoping it will eventually hatch.

We have a two wonderful workshops this month "Plant Spirit Healing" presented by Easton herbalist Alexandra Leigh on June 14th; and on June 28th "Solutions for Problem Hauntings" with well-known author Rosemary Guiley. Now, let's get back to talking about my garden, because I'm hoping you will be inspired to plant an herb garden of your own! Gilbertie's is located at 7 Sylvan Lane in Westport (<http://www.gilbertiesherbs.com/index.html>) they hold a fabulous half-off sale for one weekend at the end of June, call them for dates (227-4175). In my "past life" I worked as the Perennial Plant Manager at Greenfield Hill Nursery and was a freelance garden writer, as well as an officer of the Fairfield County Horticultural Society. So, here we go:

My little fenced-in garden was formerly a grassy play area for the children of the former homeowners. I removed the playset, as well as the grass, and created geometric squares, rectangles and diamonds using old landscape timbers, and placed flat rocks in sand to walk on. In the centers of the little plots I planted dwarf fruit trees and shrubs – columnar and dwarf apples, blueberries, quince, and goumi. An excellent resource for truly unusual fruiting shrubs/trees is "One Green World" located in California - <https://www.onegreenworld.com> - although shipping to the East Coast will have to wait for next season, sorry. I purchased both my goumi and quince from them, love the work they are doing bringing hardy edible plants from all over the world to American backyards. Since last year's tomato, green bean, lettuce and carrot crops were a dismal failure (thank you, chickens and goats for whom an open garden gate equates a free lunch) I decided to forego veggies and add more herbs. In that mint barrel, I planted white and variegated mints and placed tiny Corsican mint at its base. This plant may not be hardy (we'll see) but it looks like Irish Moss with a lovely mint scent when you brush against it. So sweet! This area is semi-shady and damp so it's also home to Japanese painted ferns, lady's mantle, and lily of the valley. I added a Carruth Shrub Rose "Midnight Blue" in the center of another plot – this dark purple rose has a strong spicy clove scent, and is filling in for the more authentic apothecary (Damask) rose I'd like to have planted but know would never survive our winter. In that plot, I've got feverfew, rue, a sweet daisylike perennial (kalimeria) named "Daisy Mae" (how could I resist? For those who do not know, that is my youngest daughter's name). In a larger plot where veggies formerly grew – now there's a tangled mess of tansy, bee balm (Jacob Cline, a pink variety supposedly mildew-resistant) and two big clumps of fragrant

reblooming daylily “Hyperion” which is my favorite butter yellow color. Where tomatoes (fullest sun) grew, I now have St. John’s wort, sorrel, horehound, a dwarf blueberry, comfrey – this edged with curly parsley. Under my quince tree, I have lemon balm which does a great impression of Adolf Hitler as it refuses to recognize borders and tries to invade everywhere! Ditto a huge clump of ever-expanding mugwort which will soon to be cut, dried and offered for sale at the shop. I have strawberries under a columnar apple; marjoram and lamb’s ears under a dwarf apple; honeysuckle growing over the fence and around the goumi tree (large shrub, really). Add Echinacea, sedum, anise hyssop, chives, peony, heliotrope, bleeding heart, Siberian iris, a small hydrangea and deciduous azalea, a reblooming white iris “Immortality” (LOVE that name!) geez .. what else? Well, I seeded nasturtiums, blue flax, soapwort, and my beloved California poppies all throughout. Can’t believe I couldn’t find seeds of my favorite little annual French marigold (tagetes) not to be confused with what you buy in flats at the garden center ... these are REAL marigolds, repel insects and are so very easy to grow from seed. And again, that soft yellow color. My favorite combination? White alyssum, blue forget-me-knots and orange California poppies. Buy seed packets, mix together and toss in every sunny dry but well-drained spot (after tilling up the ground a bit first of course) these just look great together. Water lightly until they sprout then leave alone – they are annuals but will self-sow and come back year after year (God willing and the creek don’t rise ...). It makes me smile just thinking about this trio!

I know what you are thinking – Laura, where is the Sage? The lavender? Well even with sun and semi-raised beds in my garden when these herbs managed to survive the winter, the spring thaw drowned them. They can’t take being buried weeks on end under heavy snow and ice. They need to be kept dry or they will rot. Fennel was also a big failure. I want to add angelica, motherwort, skullcap ... when I find them, I’ll fit them in. Gilbertie’s will probably have them a little later in the season, we got off to a late start with the cold spring. And while I love (and use) the baneful herbs, anything toxic could be deadly to my greedy garden-grubbing goats so I order these from www.thepumpkinandthecauldron.com and REAL mandrake (and other great stuff) from Raven Grimassi’s website www.ravensloft.biz. I recommend two books: *Cunningham’s Encyclopedia of Magical Herbs* (yes, ANOTHER order to Llewellyn is about to be placed as my last order of books flew out of the shop, literally!) and *The Illustrated Herb Encyclopedia – A complete Culinary, Cosmetic, Medicinal, and Ornamental Guide to Herbs* by Kathi Keville. Look to Gilbertie’s for low-priced classes as well – taught by their friendly knowledgeable staff. Love these folks, they are down to earth and genuinely nice.

I'm laughing, re-reading the description of my garden ... good grief it's the horticultural equivalent of Talisman! Stuff everywhere, rather untidy but I honestly don't have ability (or desire) to scale back or be neat. It may be a great mess, but it's comfortable and fun – exactly the way I hope my shop feels for all of you. Now, get out there and get those hands dirty! And here is some food for thought:

We do things a bit differently at Talisman. You pay our readers AFTER the reading is finished, and if you are not happy you don't pay. NO READER can read EVERYONE successfully and everyone who works at Talisman is aware of this fact. Know that it is acceptable after the first 5 minutes of a reading to say something like, "I'm sorry, what you are saying just isn't resonating with me. I would like to stop the reading now, but thank you for your time". If you do not hear something amazing in the first five minutes, or if it just isn't right ... don't expect a reading to get better as it goes on. Readings go off track for a number of reasons - but the point is, you shouldn't pay if you are not happy. Please, just be courteous and respectful. Complaints are rare because every reader has had to pass the "ultimate interview" ... they must sit and read ME (and I've been reading over 25 years myself) and tell me something about my past/personal life, my children, home, or business that they could not possibly have heard or learned someplace else. But every reader has their unique gift and their own style, it is NOT one size fits all. Personally, I don't think anyone should get a reading more than once every 6-8 weeks and prefer you allow at least 3 months between readings ... you don't want to become a psychoholic, right? Astrology Corner

June commences under the residual influence of [May's Grand Water Trine](#), which ain't half bad because this can help boost our mood & smooth over any leftover ragged emotional edges that may still be remaining. Meanwhile, Venus sits pretty (pun intended) in Taurus while in lovely aspect to both Neptune & Mercury. This is a strong position for Venus, planet of relationships and finances, to be in – the sextile to Mercury is good for business transactions, financial agreements, and talking about your feelings re: all matters love & money related. Her simultaneous sextile to Neptune can also stimulate acts of charitable giving or forgiveness. One example of how these energies might be well combined could be through raising money for a charitable endeavor via a telethon or pledge drive – speaking to the public about a financial matter using emotion and the ability to empathize in order to facilitate giving. On a more mundane level, if you want to plead a financial case of some kind at the beginning of the month, use the emotional component conferred by this combo to produce favorable results.

This is quite a busy month for our gal Venus as she makes hits to Pluto on the 8th, Saturn on the 13th, Jupiter on the 18th, and finally Neptune on the 29th as well – those with Taurus or Libra Suns/Risings should pay particularly special attention to her activities during June. But for all signs regardless, her contact to Pluto can be beneficial for securing a loan of some kind (particularly business), for facilitating good relations with influential people (provided you meet all

your obligations), & for the cohesion of powerful alliances that merger business w/ pleasure in some way. Her opposition to Saturn on May 13th may put the brakes on these matters a bit and give us an opportunity to be sure we know how deep we're getting ourselves in, which I actually see as a good thing. Venus opposite Saturn asks us to know our limits, responsibilities, and when to say "no" – if we encounter resistance to our financial plans, relationships, etc. at this time, know that it's really just a check & balance to make sure your footing is solid **before** you get in too deep! Now the sextile to Jupiter on the 18th, on the other hand, is a nice one that can facilitate acts of financial generosity - particularly from women or family. If you need a financial favor, this influence may help but be sure if one is granted to you that you live up to your obligation in the matter. I say this because Venus' square to Neptune at the end of the month could = a fool & his money are soon parted - needless to say, the end of the month is also a time to beware of wily salesmen, of fast-talkers running cons, or anyone that might give you a sob story in order to bilk you out of some \$.

Now for the lunations....! The Full Sagittarius Moon on the 13th stresses the need for an all-encompassing view of both the big picture AND the details. The Moon is quincunx Jupiter on this day, suggesting that our perspectives/judgment may be easily influenced by our emotion. So before letting our feelings run away with us, we might deflate them a bit by looking at the situation in smaller, more rational components. I find it interesting this Full Moon occurs on the very same day the opposition between Saturn & Venus is exact....I would take that as a need to get perspective thru the gathering of more information or details so that we can see a situation in its totality, and this might be directly or indirectly regarding a stop-sign we seem to be getting in a love or money related matter. This lunation's T-square to Chiron makes me think we could potentially be flying blind, so now is not the time to gloss over what could be critical information or to fail to perform our due diligence! We might need to wait for more things to come to light before solidifying a partnership, alliance, or fiscal matter. For relationships in particular, it may be smart to wait a good week and a half from this date if possible before initiating any action because Mars tangles with both Pluto & Uranus during this time. Its square to Pluto on the 14th may see something hidden come roiling up to the surface, while its opposition to Uranus on the 25th can bring unanticipated events, shocks, or surprises from out of the woodwork.

Make a wish for something you feel very deeply about during the Cancer New Moon on the 27th, because a trine to magical Neptune can facilitate magic & miracles. This is the first Cancer New Moon we've had in some time that hasn't been hit full-on by all the ongoing Cardinal Madness, so it's a lower-key event than it has been in recent years. The Moon does still manage to catch a glancing opposition from Pluto, but if it's a wish for something that transforms the framework of your life, your family, or breaks down a non-functional Established Order of some kind, this opposition can be an asset. Our sense of security may be a little shaky, but keeping the faith and

seeking spiritual understanding can help us transcend any fears that might threaten to undermine the opportunity for an emotional new beginning this lunation offers us. For example, if we want to start a family and become pregnant, this Moon can help answer our wishes and prayers. Finding out we are expecting may be initially a little scary at first because the framework of our whole lives will undergo a substantial change, but realizing what a miracle life is can help us rise above any initial discomfort we may have. The general types of situations we encounter at this time can help us open up to a new phase of emotional & psychological development, and realizing that "*everything happens for a reason*" can help us break down defunct habits & emotional responses so we can reach a state of acceptance of/surrender to the Divine Design.

The only other note is Mercury is retrograde practically all month long. As such, it's a good month to subjectively review and talk about all matters related to family and feelings since we'll have it hovering between the signs of Cancer and Gemini. Retrograde phases are better suited toward periods of internal review rather than external activity, and because of this I would hold off on scheduling a family picnic or weekend getaway during June - especially if we need to review our emotions related to our kin for some reason or have a talk with them.
