LIVESTOCK: General Rules

- 1. The rules and regulations of this fair and livestock show are made by a board of directors. The board of directors reserves the right to add to these rules to protect exhibitors, if necessary.
- 2. All OWNERS of livestock or others having same in charge shall care for, guard, protect and preserve the same as the Lonoke County Fair and Livestock Show Association does not undertake to do so and it shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to property or the owners thereof.
- 3. The Lonoke County Fair and Livestock Show will be held at the Fair Grounds in Lonoke on the 3rd full week of September.
- 4. All livestock must pre-register by September 1st.
- 5. The decision of the judges shall be final and no appeal will be considered.
- 6. See SCHEDULE for time for animals to be in place.
- 7. Judging will be done in the order listed in the schedule of events.
- 8. Premiums will be paid on the point basis. The total number of points awarded in all departments will be divided into the total sum allocated to the county to determine the amount of money to be paid on each point. This amount, multiplied by the number of points awarded to a particular animal, is the premium which will be paid. Not less than 25% of state money must be used for paying premiums to winners in the junior livestock division.
- 9. All exhibits must remain in place during the county fair. Early departure will cause forfeiture of prize money.
- 10. Check-out time for livestock is Saturday, 11:00 p.m.
- 11. No spaces will be provided nor entries accepted for items not listed in the catalogue.
- 12. All horses must remain on the west side of the fairgrounds, with the exception of pony rides.
- 13. NO DOGS are allowed on fairgrounds except Saturday during the Pet Show from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED IN LIVESTOCK BARNS AT ANY TIME.
- 14. NO SMOKING in the barns or buildings at any time.
- 15. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES will NOT be tolerated on the fair or rodeo grounds under any circumstances. Violators are subject to prosecution.
- 16. If you are going to another show and need to leave before the designated check-out time, you MUST notify the livestock superintendent when you check in.

LIVESTOCK: Exhibit Rules

Livestock Superintendent: Clarence Ross

- 1. Pre-registration is required by **September 1**st for all livestock.
- 2. 4-H and FFA swine must have premise identification tags.
- 3. All livestock health papers shall be shown to superintendent before the unloading of all animals NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 4. All animals must be shown in either Pee Wee, Junior or Open Division
- 5. All animals must have descriptions on health papers.
- 6. Open and Junior exhibitors must leave the animals on exhibit until **11:00 pm on Saturday.** Early departure will cause forfeiture of prize money. If you are going to another show and need to leave before designated check-out time, you MUST notify the livestock superintendent when you check IN.
- 7. All competing animals shall be entered for exhibit in the name of the owner as shown on registration papers. Registered or pure bred animals can be entered.
- 8. Premiums on livestock and other exhibits will be paid by check.
- 9. Feed and water buckets, bedding and halter must be provided by exhibitor.
- 10. Stalls for livestock will be assigned on a reserved basis by the superintendent of each section.
- 11. No commercial or crossbred bulls will be shown.
- 12. An exhibitor cannot show the same animal in the Pee Wee, Junior and Open Division.
- 13. An exhibitor can show only two animals in one class except where noted in special group classes.
- 14. Livestock must be shown (paraded) to be eligible for ribbons and cash awards.
- 15. Only exhibitors or herdsmen will be allowed to stay overnight in the cattle barn.
- 16. Exhibitor's excess feed, hay and bedding should be kept in a trailer.
- 17. All Open livestock must pay an entry fee per head. See each breed for amount. Must be paid upon arrival.
- 18. NO SHAVING OR SHEARING OF LAMBS OR GOATS ON FAIRGROUNDS.
- 19. All Longhorns are required to measure the width of each animal from one tip of the horn to the other for adequate stall space.
- 20. If any exhibitor would like to be stalled with or by another exhibitor(s), please notify superintendent before arriving with animal.
- 21. Market Animals Only A junior Exhibitor must be an active FFA or 4-H member to show in the Lonoke County Fair and must live or go to school in Lonoke County. Market animals can only be shown in one county fair.
- 22. Breeding Stock Only Out of county livestock may show if the fair has room to accommodate them and if money is added to the premium fund. Out of county exhibitors are NOT eligible to compete for scholarship money.
- 23. Showmanship Exhibitor must LIVE in Lonoke County to eligible for showmanship scholarship.
- 24. Junior livestock exhibitors must be 9 years old by September 1.
- 25. No premium money will be paid until stalls and pens are cleaned and checked by superintendent.

Definition of Classes

Junior and Senior Division

- 1. **Junior Get-of-Sire:** Group to consist of two animals under two years of age, one of which has freshened; either sex, the get-of-one-sire; not more than two can be bulls. Sire must be named and each exhibitor is limited to one entry sired by the same bull. Animals may be owned by one or more exhibitor.
- 2. **Dairy Herd:** Group to consist of four cows that have freshened. All are to be owned by exhibitor. Each exhibitor limited to one entry.
- 3. **Best Three Females:** Any age, all are to have been bred and owned by exhibitor. Each exhibitor limited to one entry.
- 4. **Senior Get-of-Sire:** Group to consist of four females, at least two over two years of age that have calved. Animals may be owned by one or more exhibitor. Sire must be named.
- 5. **Produce of Dam:** Group to consist of two animals, any age, either sex, the produce of one cow. The dam must be named. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry from the same cow. Animals need not be owned by one exhibitor.
- 6. **Daughter-Dam:** A cow and one offspring of any age. Animals may be owned by one or more exhibitor. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry from each dam.
- 7. **Grand Champion Classes**: 2nd place of class that Grand Champion is selected from will compete for Reserve Champion.
