# Horticulture

# **Youth, Junior & Senior Divisions**

- 1. Any flowering plant in a hanging container can be 4" to 12". Basket must contain all hanging equipment with watering saucer attached.
- 2. Any foliage or flowering plant in a container no larger than a 3 gallon size with watering saucer. Must be repotted from original nursery container.
- 3. Potted Foliage Plants are those appreciated primarily for the quality of the blooms.
- 4. Any plants having special requirements MUST have care instructions attached.
- 5. Entrants will be allowed to enter only one specimen of each variety in each section. Number of total entries will vary by section.
- 6. Flower arrangements can be either fresh or dried but NO commercial arrangements will be accepted.
- 7. Superintendents and/or judges have the authority to disqualify any items they deem inappropriate.
- 8. \*denotes not eligible for State Fair.
- 9. Cut flowers:
  - a. Exhibitors can only enter 5 differing single stem flowers.
  - b. All specimens should be entered in bud vases provided by exhibitors
- 10. All specimens will be judged for horticultural perfection
- 11. Fruits, Vegetables & Field Crops:
  - a. An exhibitor may display one item per class.
  - b. Unusual items are things not commonly grown in this area (i.e. bananas, oranges, lemons).

## **Section A – Hanging and Patio Plants**

- 1) Hanging single specimen, foliage plant in hanging container.
- 2) Hanging single flowering plant in hanging container
- 3) Fern one plant variety
- 4) Hanging basket using 2 or more varieties of plants
- 5) Patio container using 2 or more varieties of plants
- 6) Any other plant

## Section B - Potted Foliage Plants

# **Section F - Floral Arrangements**

Includes arrangements, wreaths, wall hangings, etc. in which flowers and greenery are used as a major part of the exhibit. NO artificial materials accepted. When appropriate, the container will be judged as part of the exhibit

- 1) Arrangement of cut flowers
- Arrangement of dried native materials
- 3) Wreath herb
- 4) Wreath dried native materials
- 5) Arrangement of Arkansas farming or country industry in mind.
