DIVISIONS: PEEWEE 5-8 * YOUTH 9-12 * JUNIOR 12-18 * SENIOR 19-OVER

IMPORTANT: Items will be brought into the Education Building through the new entrance on the back side of the building. Take Hwy 89 to Kirk Avenue and park behind the Education Building by the Rodeo Arena. Come into the building via the hallway by the new bathrooms. The front entrance will be **LOCKED** on Tuesday and **NOT** accessible during check-in.

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RULES:

1. PeeWee's (ages 5-8) will be allowed to show in any division. Only Ribbons will be awarded, no premium points.
2. Exhibitors must register at the door before registering their exhibits with the Department Chairman.
3. Commercial and professional exhibitors are not permitted to enter exhibits in the Educational and Home Economics area.
4. Points are awarded as designated in the premium list. Exhibits are judged on merit. Those worthy of red, blue or white premium ribbons will be awarded points.
5. The judges will examine items extensively. The judge has the authority to disqualify the exhibit if it does not warrant a premium. Judges decisions are final.
6. Articles not conforming to the sections and classes listed in the catalog can be entered as a wild card/other. One wild card/other per section for each exhibitor.
7. Exhibits must be clean, in first class condition and not shown in a previous Lonoke County Fair.
8. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor and completed since previous County Fair
9. Superintendents for each department have the right to reject any article which they feel does not qualify to show.
10. Judging will begin Wednesday at 9:00 am. After conclusion of the judging, exhibits will be open to the public for viewing.
11. The Lonoke County Fair Association will exercise precaution to prevent loss or damage, but will not be responsible should any occur.
12. The Lonoke County Fair Association will not be responsible for exhibits not picked up by 4:00 pm on Sunday.
13. Best of Show will be awarded in Youth, Junior and Senior divisions in each category and will receive an additional 3 points if the judges deem approved.
