It's that time of year again - spring has already made its presence known by full blossoms and pollen and flowers. Trust me, I am adjusting to the allergies here in South Texas. The month of May is what I call the start of the summer activities. There is National Day of Prayer, Mother's Day, Graduations and vacation planning. I used to always use May as my launch for a Sermon Series on the Family. I know with all the busy schedules of getting to the end of the school year and ready for summer, often families can be pushed aside. It isn't intentional; in fact, most of the plans we will make include the family, but while they may be the ones sparking the plans and all, actual quality time can be lost in the busyness of the events. While in the Air Force, we were always challenged to keep our families informed and when we were not "mission oriented" to make sure they knew how much we loved them and the sacrifices they made for the service member to serve in the military. I remember one time while in Utah, I was part of a rapid deployment unit; we were always gone doing something. The overwhelming feedback was "kids today do not have any role models for what it means to be a boy or girl." Of course, that fact drove our ministry to the church and the community. I think this is one of the most critical areas of our society right now. It seems like culture is trying to make gender identity neutral and make people all the same. God created us with specific design qualities and characteristics. Humanity should not be lumped into a "non-descript" box.

On another note, I have been busy trying to meet all our pastors and visit in their churches – it's a work in progress. Galveston Baptist Churches are doing some amazing ministries. My fear is that most of it goes unnoticed. I hope in the very near future to start a section in our newsletter that will highlight each church and its contribution to Advancing the Gospel in the 4B area.

As I draw this article to a close; let's all remember to lift each other up. Ministry is difficult at best; the enemy wants to see us defeated and demoralized – pray for each other specifically and thank you for all your prayers for me and my family!
