

ALL RELEVANT LOCAL, STATE, AND FEDERAL LAWS SHALL BE ENFORCED. THESE INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING:

- **Trash** – Cleaning up after your party is a must to ensure that you do not receive a sanitation violation. Picking up the yard and the street area is the best way to make sure your trash does not blow around the neighborhood and become a problem for your neighbors.
- **Noise** – The Noise Ordinance prohibits excessive, unnecessary, or unusually loud noise or any noise which disturbs, annoys, injures or endangers the comfort, repose or health, peace or safety of persons of ordinary sensibilities. This can include a gathering of even a small group talking or yelling loudly and does not necessarily have to include the sounds of “music.”
- **Open Containers** – It is unlawful to have open containers of alcohol in a motor vehicle or anywhere that is open to the public.
- **Prohibitions** – It is unlawful for any person under the age of 21 to possess or consume beer, wine or liquor.
- **Furnishing** – It is unlawful for any person to sell or give any alcoholic beverage to a person under the age of 21. It is also unlawful for anyone to allow people under the age of 21 to possess alcohol at their event.
- **Disorderly Conduct** - Persons exercising loud/profane language are in violation of the Kent City Disorderly Conduct Ordinance. Persons urinating within any public area are in violation of the City’s Disorderly Conduct Ordinance and Indecent Exposure. Public intoxication is also a violation of this section.
- **Obstructing Official Business**– It is unlawful to hinder/try to prevent any police officer in the discharge of the officer’s duties.

The above mentioned laws and ordinances are only a few, but are the most common, violations observed by persons attending parties. As the party host you need to be vigilant of these violations and take every precaution necessary to prevent violations from occurring.
