



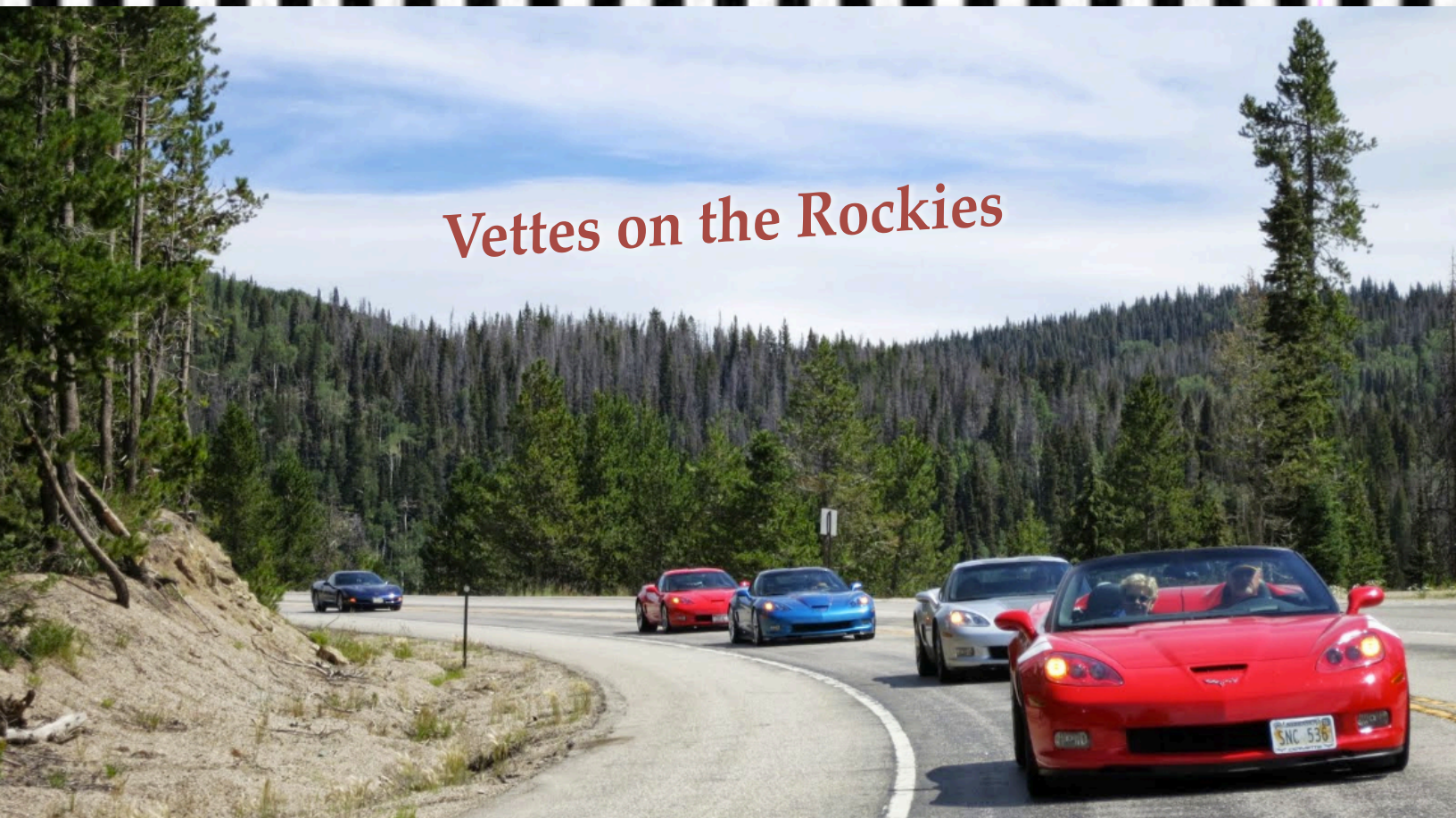

CLOSE ENCOUNTER OF THE CORVETTE KIND

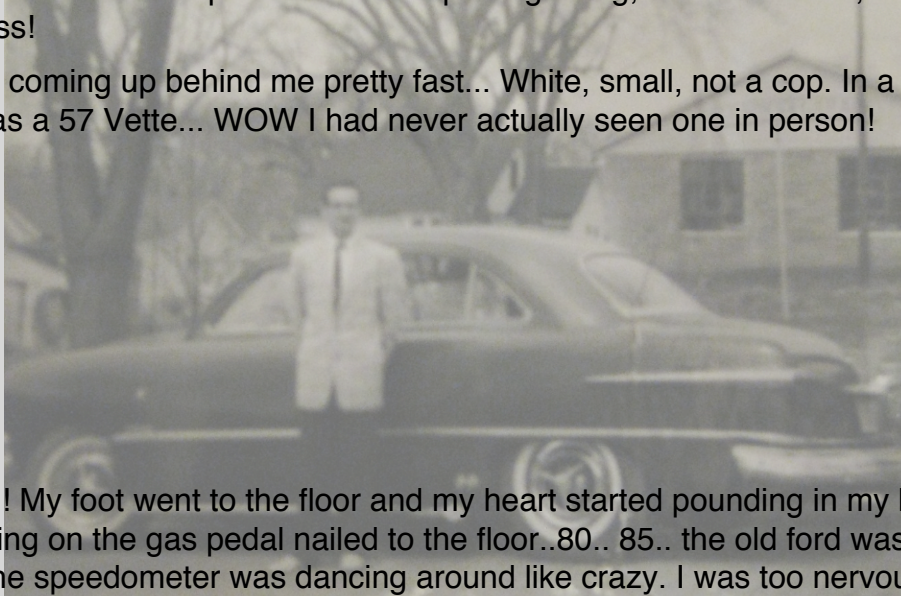
It was the spring of 59. School was out, I was 16 and on my first road trip to visit relatives without the company of adult supervision.

General Meeting

July 18, 2013

Rick Harshbarger, Sargent at Arms announced the meeting will begin in five minutes and to please shut off cell phones and pagers.

Kevin Kohlscheen, President led members in the Pledge of Allegiance and opened the meeting with a welcome to members and guests. He announced a ballot vote will be taken tonight following the new by-law ballot counting procedures. The vote will determine CCC's donation to the NCM One Acre Club. Allen Sohl handed out ballots to eligible voting members as they signed in. The Members at Large each selected two members to count ballots. Members were asked to place their count now and the announcement will be made at the end of the meeting.

Bob Speckmann, Perry Dawes and Gene Gau introduced visitors.

Marie Manz, Membership Director introduced nine new members and each received the club's raise and clap welcome. Our total NCCC membership is 350 with an additional 16 social members. The members with July birthdays were announced with last call for 50/50 raffle ticket sales.

Pattie Bena, Secretary received a motion to accept last month's minutes from Sheron Lambert with a second from Colleen Norgard. She announced Summer Festival shirts are for sale this evening; also there are samples of sizes small through 3X of the new ladies ¾ sleeve style shirt. Orders will be taken tonight for the new shirts and T-shirts or tanks since the current supply is limited. She announced only a small supply will be available during SF weekend in an attempt to avoid an excess of left over shirts and suggested purchasing or placing an order this week. The second order will be available at the August general meeting.

Pam and Mark DeLong, Social Directors gave a recap of the recent socials: Seward, NE, Pizza King after the Mall of the Bluffs autocross and Hot Summer Nights. They announced details for upcoming socials:

7/28 – Louisville Car Show (leaving El Bee's on HW 50 at 8:30 a.m.)

7/31 – Vettes on the Rockies – Gene reported 13 cars will travel to the event and suggested CB radio

Tom Horeis, Treasurer gave the financial report.

Bob Speckmann, Public Relations Director gave details on the H & H Car Show and encouraged attendance to show appreciation to this important contributor and asked for several workers to assist with parking cars. Bob reported he visited several contributors and delivered invoices.

Gary Brisbois, Governor reported on the recent Governor's meeting at Bowling Green, KY. NCCC continues to stress any use of the C7 logo must be purchased from a licensed GM dealer. The NCCC 2012 #1 Club was CCC with 21,700 points, #2 was Windy City and #3 the Oklahoma Club. Three of the Top 15 in competition are from CCC: Kathy Gau #10, Gene Gau #14 and Joe Eller #15. Larry Lichtenwald of the West Region was #1. Other winners from convention were announced and Sandy Swift modeled her winning Derby Hat. One of the NCCC \$1,000 scholarships was awarded to Amanda Olson, daughter of CCC members Craig and Monique Olson.

Don Angerth, Competition Director reported the full lot at Mall of the Bluffs will be available for SF low speed, The unofficial date for a Fun Day at MAM is 8/20 with a cost of \$50 per driver. Upcoming events: 8/3 Heartland's autocross and PC at MAM, 8/17-18 autocross at Ankeny, IA, 8/24-25 Hawkeye Downs, 8/30-9/2 Summer Festival.

Anita Poss, Summer Festival Director presented the SF flier. The weekend schedule was reviewed and noted workers are needed for the PC, Funkhana and Poker Run which will end at MAM. Jim Benedict will give drag racing tips prior to the races. A special license is required for Monday's high speed events and can be obtained through RCD. PL will head up tech and encouraged everyone to tech on Friday. The big 60th birthday bash for Sunday night will be funded by Harchelroad's special contribution with food, door prizes, games and fun for all CCC members. A club record for 1/8 mile drags will be established and a trophy awarded for overall SF points.

Kevin Reit, Vice President thanked the DeLong's for their coordination of the Hot Summer Night road trip and social. Kevin gave a humorous recap of "issues" at the hotel he arranged for and prime street parking which turned out to be under the Turkey Vultures. Apparently only the Swifts were brave enough to join him for breakfast the next morning!

JB Benedict, Point Chairman reported points through the end of June placing CCC first in the West Region by 5000 points with a total of 6,083. CCC leads NCCC with 8100 points; 2000 points over the 2nd place club. Individual points report is available on registration table. He announced the third Leach Open House is 9/7 with workers needed for 9-noon and noon-3 shifts and noted this is the same day as Sid Dillon car show.

The winner of the birthday drawing was Colleen Norgard.

The 50/50 raffle was won by Carolyn Reade with \$115 awarded to Carolyn and \$115 to the National Kidney Foundation.

Teresa Eller reported on the 12" NCM brick donated in memory of Dave Hawks.

Pattie Bena announced the ballot vote did not approve the club donation to the NCM One Acre Club.
